Temporary Full Railroad Crossing Closure on State Road (SR) 944/NW 54 Street/Hialeah Drive Begins December 9

MIAMI, Fla. – The South Florida Regional Transportation Authority (SFRTA), in coordination with the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), will close SR 944/NW 54 Street/Hialeah Drive from SE 10 Avenue to NW 37 Avenue in Miami-Dade County from 10 p.m., Friday, December 9 to 4 a.m., Monday, December 12, 2022, weather permitting. This detour is being established to allow workers to reconstruct the railroad crossing signal devices.

During this closure, all traffic will be detoured away from the crossing as follows:

Eastbound Detour:

- Turn right on SE 10 Avenue
- Turn right on SE 5 Street
- Turn left on SE 9 Court.
- Turn left on SE 8 Street
- Turn left on NW 37 Avenue to get back to NW 54 Street

Westbound Detour:

- Turn left on NW 37 Avenue
- Turn right on NW 46 Street
- Turn right on SE 9 Court
- Turn right on SE 5 Street
- Turn left on SE 10 Avenue to get back to NW 54 Street

Please note this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unexpected conditions.
