FDOT District Six to Host In-Person and Virtual Public Hearing for the Venetian Causeway PD&E Study

from North Bayshore Drive to Purdy Avenue

Miami, FL – The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District Six, will hold a Public Hearing for the above referenced project in-person on Tuesday, May 11, 2021 at the Miami Beach Botanical Garden located at 2000 Convention Center Drive, Miami Beach, FL 33139; and simultaneously online using GoTo Webinar. This Public Hearing is being held as part of a current Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study that is being conducted to evaluate proposed transportation solutions for this segment of Venetian Causeway and to provide documented information necessary for FDOT to reach a decision on the type, design, and location of the improvements. The project is being developed to address identified structural and functional deficiencies of the 12 existing bridges through potential alternatives such as replacement or rehabilitation while minimizing potential impacts to the natural and human environments.
