The New York State Canal Corporation kicks off its SUNY/Erie Canal Bicentennial Forum Series at the Brighton Campus of Monroe Community College with a focus on “Accessible Recreation on the Canalway.”

In addition, vendors will be on hand to showcase accessible/adaptive equipment, funding opportunities and information to assist businesses and municipalities from throughout the New York State Canal system corridor that are seeking to increase accessibility to the canal and Canalway Trail in their area.

The SUNY/Erie Canal Bicentennial Forum Series is part of New York State’s commemoration of the 200th anniversary of the original Erie Canal’s opening in 1825 and the waterway’s continued influence on the state. The Erie Canal’s Bicentennial celebration will culminate with the 2025 World Canals Conference in Buffalo.
