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Illinois 1 pavement sealing begins Oct. 3

CHICAGO – The Illinois Department of Transportation announced today that a crack and joint sealing of Illinois 1 (Halsted Street/Chicago Road), from Strieff Lane, in Glenwood, to Scrementi Lane, in Steger, passing through, Homewood, Chicago Heights and South Chicago Heights, will require daily, intermittent lane closures beginning, weather permitting, Monday, Oct. 3.

The project, which consists of routing, cleaning and sealing cracks along the 6.5-mile stretch of Illinois 1, to extend its useful life, along with new pavement markings, is expected to be completed in November.

Motorists can expect delays and should allow extra time for trips through this area. Drivers are urged to pay close attention to flaggers and signs in the work zones, obey the posted speed limits and be on the alert for workers and equipment.

Over the next six years, IDOT is planning to improve more than 2,500 miles of highway and nearly 10 million square feet of bridge deck as part of the Rebuild Illinois capital program, which is investing \$33.2 billion into all modes of transportation. Accomplishments through Year Three of Rebuild Illinois included approximately \$8.6 billion of improvements statewide on 4,422 miles of highway, 412 bridges, and 621 additional safety improvements.
