Work on Illinois 57 in Adams County resumes March 8

QUINCY – The Illinois Department of Transportation announces that work construction on a 7.1-mile stretch of Illinois 57 from Maine Street in Quincy to just south of Marblehead resumes March 8.

The project involves pavement patching and resurfacing, replacement of a concrete deck, and improvements to intersections and pedestrian accommodations. At times during construction, lane closures with width reductions as well as flaggers will be necessary. Every effort will be made to maintain access to homes and businesses during the work, which is expected to be complete in September.

The end result of the project will be a smoother driving surface as well as improved safety for drivers and pedestrians.

Motorists can expect delays and should allow extra time for trips through this area. To avoid the work area, when feasible, use of alternate routes should be considered. Drivers are urged to pay close attention to changed conditions and signs in the work zones, obey the posted speed limits, refrain from using mobile devices and be alert for workers and equipment.

Over the next six years, IDOT is planning to improve more than 3,300 miles of highway and 8.4 million square feet of bridge deck as part of the Rebuild Illinois, which is investing \$33.2 billion into all modes of transportation. Year One included approximately \$2.7 billion of improvements statewide on 1,706 miles of highway and 128 bridges along with 228 additional safety improvements.
