Work at Pinecrest over I-74 resumes May 10

Placement of bridge beams expected to last three nights

EAST PEORIA – The Illinois Department of Transportation announces that construction of the new Pinecrest Drive bridge over Interstate 74 resumes May 10.

The work involves placing steel beams and will require lane closures in one or both directions between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. over three nights. In addition, full closure of I-74 at Pinecrest in both directions is planned from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. nightly. I-74 traffic will use the off- and on-ramps at Pinecrest to navigate the closure.

The work is part of a \$9.6 million project to replace the Pinecrest Drive bridge, made possible by Gov. JB Pritzker's historic and bipartisan Rebuild Illinois capital program. The new bridge will have a minimum clearance of 16 feet 6 inches, or two feet higher than the existing bridge. The entire project is expected to be complete in November.

Motorists can expect delays and should allow extra time for trips through this area. To avoid the work area, when feasible, use of alternate routes should be considered. Drivers are urged to pay close attention to changed conditions and signs in the work zones, obey the posted speed limits, refrain from using mobile devices and be alert for workers and equipment.

Over the next six years, IDOT is planning to improve more than 3,300 miles of highway and 8.4 million square feet of bridge deck as part of the Rebuild Illinois capital program, which is investing \$33.2 billion into all modes of transportation. Year One included approximately \$2.7 billion of improvements statewide on 1,706 miles of highway, 128 bridges and 228 additional safety improvements.
