



## PEDESTRIAN **SIGN PROGRAM**



Madison Main Street offers the Wayfinder Corner Directional Signs program to assist in promotion of an attractive and coordinated program to assist in promotion of an attractive and coordinated image for Downtown Madison. It also enhances pedestrian circulation within a dense Downtown environment. Please Note: These corner signs provide directional information to the pedestrian (not intended for the driving public) and are sized accordingly.

Metal freestanding posts with two arms are situated on the corners of main intersections. Individual panels hang from a cast iron bracket. All panels use the standard design, having the same material, coloring and size

lettering. Only eight panels are installed per pole per direction.

Madison Main Street owns all signs and panels, offering individual panels for long-term lease for a one-time service fee to businesses located in the Downtown Special Tax District. Panels may have two lines of copy. Each panel is dual-sided and features the same copy on both sides. A directional arrow indicates the quickest route to the business location.

### **Using The Flags:**

- The flags are kept on a post located on each side of the crosswalk
- Remove one flag from the holder only one flag per group is necessary
- Hold the flag to make the flag visible to drivers on your left
- When traffic on your left has stopped, proceed with caution in the crosswalk
- · As you approach the center of the road make the flag visible to drivers on your
- Make sure all lanes of traffic have stopped before completing the crossing
- After crossing the street, place the flag in the holder for others to use

## PEDESTRIAN FLAGS FOR SAFETY **AROUND DOWNTOWN**

In the summer of 2017, the City of Madison rolled out a tool to help people safely navigate crosswalks in high-traffic areas. Five years later, guests to Downtown can still safely cross streets by utilizing the brightly colored flags which are held in pedestrian crosswalk flag holders which are located at identified crosswalks.

These pedestrian crosswalk flags are intended to serve as a safety

enhancement for crossing pedestrians by gaining the visibility of motorists. Pedestrians may carry the flags across the road but should still always activate the crossing signals where available and follow the


