Purpose of the meeting: To discuss the CARC review process for reconsidering the cancer classification of MITC. The MITC Task Force has procedural questions for submitting a range-finding study report that was previously requested by HED. The Task Force would also like to know if there is anything more the HED team needs for the CARC meeting.

HED noted that the CARC meeting for MITC is scheduled for the end of Nov. The committee will review the proposal, make their assessment, and a formal memo will follow the meeting on the decision. A 4-week range-finding study (2013) that was cited in the Task Force proposal was not found in HED's database for MITC. HED noted that the study is not considered critical to the assessment, since there is another study in the current database that evaluated the same endpoint and exposure timepoint.

The MITC Task Force stated that it has the study. They noted that there were 2 amendments to it, the latest is from 2020, but the amendments do not change any conclusions or and are not corrections to data. The Task Force is willing to submit it to the Agency before the CARC review on Nov. 30.

RD explained that it would take a while for the study to come in through the front end and would not be processed in time to be considered in the CARC review. The study the MITC task force has would be a good supplemental document for the CARC review but the study that was already in house with the EPA is sufficient for the review. Whether the Task Force chooses to submit the study to EPA as supplemental is up to them.

After the CARC review there will be a formal memo with the cancer reassessment determination.

On 11/9/20223 Barbara Christianson sent an email to Carmen Swinger stating the following: "Thank you again for meeting with us yesterday. Following up on one of the items we discussed, we understand that it is not needed for the review and that submitting it now may be difficult from a processing standpoint. For this reason, the Task Force will not submit the range-finding study at this time but would be pleased to do so upon request if it is needed at some future date."
