## BEACHES REOPENED FOLLOWING TSUNAMI ADVISORY

Seal Beach, CA – Seal Beach beaches are reopened following a previously issued tsunami advisory.

On Saturday, January 15, 2022, at about 6:00 am, the Seal Beach Police Department received information regarding tsunami advisory from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. Out of an abundance of caution Seal Beach beaches and pier were closed.

Later that day at about 8:00 pm, the NOAA reported that the tsunami advisory for the County of Orange had ended. As such, Seal Beach beaches and the pier have been reopened. There were no reports of injuries, excessive flooding, or other damage in Seal Beach.

Minor fluctuations slightly above or below normal tide levels may continue over the next few hours.
