Ribbon Cut at Fire Station 106 Building a Safer and Stronger Community for All

Beaumont, CA— The City of Beaumont proudly announces the completion of Fire Station 106, marking a significant milestone in the community's safety and emergency response.

On April 11, the city held a <u>ribbon-cutting ceremony</u> with local dignitaries, community leaders, and firefighters to celebrate this momentous occasion. Thirty years in the making, Fire Station 106 represents a significant achievement and dedication to ensure the safety and well-being of our residents within the City of Beaumont – particularly on the west side.

The \$8 million locally funded 10,760 square foot Fire Station features:

- A Fire Apparatus Bay that will house the Tractor Drawn Aerial Truck (TDA) (current build in progress) bringing specialized rescue equipment to the city and the entire pass area;
- Nine initial paramedic and fire response positions, which will increase to 12 once the TDA has arrived;
 and
- A police substation for report writing on the west side.

To celebrate this significant milestone, the City of Beaumont invites the entire community to join in and celebrate by attending the Fire Station Community Open House on Saturday, May 18, 2024, from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Explore our state-of-the-art facility, meet your local firefighters, watch live demonstrations, and more!
