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...a letter from Mayor George D. Alpogianis



Dear friends, neighbors and family:

It has been a busy and exciting summer in the Village of Niles. Major projects such as planning for the Golf Mill Town Center redevelopment and the construction of the Golf Mill Park/Greenwood Stormwater Basin are moving right along, and are showing just how bright the future of Niles is.

I'm also excited to share new grants that have been announced for projects in the Village of Niles. The Village of Niles was awarded a \$1.8 million Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) grant that the Village will be using to rebuild and renovate the Civic Center Plaza in front of the Village Administration Building and Niles Human Services Building. Plans for this project are in their early stages, but focus on creating a more attractive and functional space for community gatherings. Another major DCEO grant that was awarded to Niles earlier this year is \$2 million to be used towards the construction of a new salt dome, which will better serve the needs of our community. ComEd also provided us with a generous grant to install the first public electric car charging station on Village property, located at Golf Mill Park. These hard-earned grant dollars serve the purpose of bringing even more improvements to the Village of Niles—without relying on local tax dollars.

Finally, I want to remind the community that the Board and I support all people, and do not tolerate hatred of any kind. Locally and across the globe, there are far too many instances of violence between neighbors, whether physical or verbal. As demonstrated by my statements to the press condemning acts of hatred and violence in the Chicago area, and my statement in support of Ukraine and its municipalities that is displayed at our Village Hall (to name just a few examples), we will always stand for building bridges and bringing people together.

As children are returning to school, we wish you all a safe and healthy fall. We hope you'll join us at our many family-oriented events in September, and remind everyone to mark your

calendars for the annual Veterans Day ceremony on November 11 at 11:00 A.M. at the waterfall at Milwaukee and Touhy. We can never thank our veterans enough for their service.

Register to Vote

If you have an Illinois driver's license or state ID, you may register online through

the Illinois Board of Elections website at www.ova.elections. il.gov by October 23 or register in person at Village Hall by October 11. You can also register at any Early Voting site and on Election Day; however, you must vote at the same time. Please note that any voter who needs to register for the first time or file an address change must present two forms of ID, one of which shows the voter's current address.

Vote By Mail

Cook County is now offering Permanent Vote by Mail. This option will allow you to vote by mail in all subsequent elections held in Cook County. Apply online for a mail ballot application at cookcountyclerk.com/elections or request an application from the Village Clerk's office.

Early Voting At Niles Village Hall

You may vote early, in person, at Niles Village Hall on the following dates:

- October 24 through November 7
 - Monday–Saturday (9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M.)
 - Sunday (10:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M.)

Election Day

Anyone voting on Election Day must vote at his or her assigned polling place. Hours are 6:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M. Please note that Niles Village Hall is not an Election Day polling place.

The Office of the Village Clerk of the Village of Niles will be accepting nominating petitions on behalf of candidates for the Office of Village Trustee positions (three candidates to be elected at-large for four-year terms). Petition filing will occur in the Village Clerk's Office at Village Hall, 1000 Civic Center Drive, during regular business hours, weekdays, 8:30 A.M. to 5:00 P.M.

The candidate filing periods are as follows:

- November 21, 2022–November 28, 2022* for the Consolidated Primary Election (established party candidates)
- December 12, 2022–December 19, 2022 for Consolidated Election (independent and new political party candidates)

*Please note that the Village Clerk's office will be closed on *Thursdav and Fridav, November 24–25 in observance of the* Thanksgiving holiday.

A 2023 Candidate's Guide issued by the Illinois State Board of Elections will be available at www.elections. il.gov. Information is also available from the Cook County Clerk's Office at www.cookcountyclerk.com/elections. The Village Clerk's Office can only provide general information about the 2023 municipal election cycle to prospective candidates and interested citizens but does not maintain or oversee the relevant data and does not create sample forms. The information provided by the Village Clerk is not legal advice. Please contact an attorney for legal advice. All candidacy forms should be completed prior to filing. Please note that the Village Clerk's office will NOT provide notary services for nominating petitions and will not provide specific advice regarding any candidacy. Additionally, each candidate should consult Article 9 of the Illinois Election Code regarding campaign finance. Consult your attorney or the Illinois State Board of Elections for any further information.

Hydrant Painting

Neighborhoods where hydrant painting will occur this year are: Oasis, Lawrencewood Gardens, Dutchman's Point, O'Shanter Estates, River Gardens, Bunker Hill Estates and Bunker Hill.

Hydrant painting is not just for aesthetics, but also to inform the Fire Department on the flow rate of each hydrant. This information is gathered from the Village's annual hydrant flushing program. The Village of Niles hydrants are painted yellow and each



hydrant cap is painted a specific color to signify the available flow of the hydrant. These color codes relay important information to our Fire Department when responding to fires.

Leaf Collection 2022

The Village of Niles offers free in-street leaf pick up from October through November according to the following schedule. Dates marked with an asterisk (*) differ from the zone's typical day of the week, due to a holiday.

It is a violation of Village code to dump leaves in the street on dates outside the above schedule. Landscape services are responsible for removing leaves and cannot dump leaves in the street. In-street leaf collection ends after the above dates, with no exceptions.

Groot also offers a bagged yard waste collection program. Yard waste stickers are required on all yard waste bags/containers, including in December. The final yard waste collection will take place on December 15 or 16, whichever is your garbage day, so residents have two weeks after in-street leaf collection ends to bag any remaining yard waste for collection. Yard waste stickers are available for purchase at Village Hall or Niles Jewel-Osco stores for \$2 per sticker.

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Remember: Grass clippings are NOT allowed in leaf piles in the street, so do not rake them into the street. Grass clippings must be placed in yard waste collection bags/ containers, or simply be mulched on your lawn.

Tree Trimming

Tree trimming will take place in Zone 2 this year (see map above). Work will begin after November 15, 2022. Trees greater than 3.5" diameter will be trimmed. Trees will be trimmed to have an overall street clearance of 14 feet and a minimum of 8 feet of clearance above sidewalks and homes. The contractor will remove all dead wood and limbs that have poor branch unions.

Rats

Niles, like many communities around us, has been experiencing an increase in rat activity. Please consider the following steps to help keep rats away from your home as they seek warmth and food this fall.

- Keep garage doors closed
- Check for any holes that could allow entrance to sheds, garages, homes. Remember a hole as small as a quarter can be enough for a rat to gain access.
- Do not feed animals like birds, squirrels, and deer. Leaving food out even in elevated feeders can attract rats. As food sources for rats become limited in the winter, we don't want to be providing them with any additional ones.
- As fall approaches please be mindful of your Halloween displays. If possible, limit the use of gourds, cornstalk and hay.

Fire Prevention Week

Fire Prevention Week will take place October 9-15, 2022 with the theme: "Fire Won't Wait. Plan Your Escape." 2022 marks the 100th anniversary of Fire Prevention week, and this year's theme reinforces the importance of developing and practicing a home fire escape plan with all the members of the household. According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), the home is where people are at greatest risk of becoming injured or killed in a fire, and fires that occur in the home are more likely to be serious. The synthetic nature of home furnishings now causes fires to burn hotter and grow faster, which means people have less time to get out once the smoke alarm sounds. It's important to make sure your Home Fire Escape Plan meets the needs of all family-members, including those with disabilities or special needs. Ensure your home has working smoke alarms inside each bedroom, outside each bedroom and on every level of your home. Designate an outside meeting place a safe distance away from the home so that each family member knows where to meet in the event of a fire. Practice your home fire escape plan at least twice per year, review your plan with relatives or guests, and adjust it as needed to reflect any changes in the household. Lock Boxes

The NFD is committed to providing the best possible service to Niles residents and everyone else within the Village. In



the event of an emergency, it is crucial for NFD personnel to gain access to your home as quickly as possible. If you are unable to open the door, the Fire Department is forced to find another means of entry, which may result in costly damage to doors, windows, locks, etc. With a Lock Box, if you are unable to open the door, the NFD can access the Lock Box, where you will have previously placed a house key, so that they may enter the house quickly. The NFD are the only ones who can access these Lock Boxes, and they do not compromise home security. While the NFD encourages all Niles residents to purchase a highly secure Lock Box for their home, they especially recommend one for those who have a medical alarm system, those with disabilities, and

Seasonal Fire Safety Tips

Halloween

Keep all decorations away from heat sources including light bulbs, candles, heaters, or anything else that produces heat. Consider illuminating pumpkins with flashlights instead of candles to help reduce the risk of unwanted and unexpected fires.

Thanksgiving

According to the National Fire Protection Association, Thanksgiving is the leading day of the calendar year for home fires involving cooking equipment. While preparing your Thanksgiving meal, please remain in the kitchen while cooking anything on the stovetop and keep any young children at least three feet away from the stove in order to try and prevent any burns, spills, or other mishaps. Lastly, please try and keep the kitchen floor free of clutter to prevent any unintentional trips over toys, bags, purses, etc.

Animal Control Corner

With the changing seasons bringing us cooler weather, now is a perfect time to ensure your home is wildlife-proof. Wild animals are starting to seek out certain areas that may provide them better shelter to keep them warm during the winter. These areas might include your attic, soffit, or chimney. Some wild animals may also burrow underneath your porch, deck, or even the foundation of your home. Inspect all sides of your property from the ground up for holes or cracks where an animal may try to gain access to the interior of your home. Also, make sure your window wells and chimneys are securely covered and capped.

If you find a hole somewhere around your home's exterior, first ensure that there is not an animal already inside. To do this, plug the hole with a piece of cloth or crumpled-up paper that an animal can easily push aside. If the material has not moved after a few days, it is safe to seal the hole. New Squad Car Design


NPD is in the process of updating the design of its squad cars. The Department is "wrapping" the existing fleet with new graphics (pictured at top of page), changing to a new design that mirrors the traditional squad car look that people relate to and is more identifiable. The change was also supported by NPD personnel, and is more consistent with the numerous neighboring communities that have black and white police cars.

The new Golf Mill Park and Greenwood Stormwater Basin Project (pictured here) includes beautiful new gathering spaces for events and recreation, and significant stormwater control components that are already providing flood reduction benefits to Courtland Park and Ballard Terrace. Final restoration in the project area will carry over into spring.

IDOT Projects

The Illinois Department of Transportation has a significant amount of work planned within Niles this year. The resurfacing of Waukegan Road from Milwaukee to Oakton Street will undergo paving operation in mid-September. The resurfacing of Harlem from Oakton Street to Dempster Street is substantially complete. The resurfacing of Oakton Street from Busse to Waukegan restarted in early August, with major paving operations set to take place near the mid or end of September. Resurfacing of Oakton Street from Waukegan to Long is also beginning, with major paving operations set to take place in mid-October.

2022 Street Program

The quadrant bordered by Dempster, Milwaukee, Kedzie, and Oketo is 90% complete as of September 1, 2022. The first year of a potential three-year expanded program is currently under construction as follows:

- <u>August:</u> Begin paving Oriole, Oleander, Main, Kedzie, Ottawa, Ozark, Merrill/Crain, Lyons/Maryland
- <u>Early September:</u> Seward full curb
- <u>Mid September</u>: Nottingham/Jarvis/Fargo spot curb and sidewalk infill.
- Late September to early October: Alley work

Milwaukee Avenue Streetscape

In fall 2022, the crosswalk within the intersection of Howard and Milwaukee will be replaced as part of ongoing parkway beautification work in the area. Intermittent lane closures will last for about six weeks.

Ballard Culvert and Resurfacing

This IDOT drainage project is complete. The next step is the resurfacing of Ballard west of Greenwood, with concrete work expected to start at the end of August and resurfacing work to follow.

Touhy and Gross Point

This roadway project consists of intersection improvements at Touhy Avenue and Gross Point Road, as well as Touhy Avenue and Caldwell Avenue. Final design and the draft federal agreement are complete, and the project will be released for letting once IDOT signs off on the right-of-way acquisition process. The Village is hoping for late spring or early summer 2023 bidding with construction to follow soon after.

Caldwell Avenue and Cleveland Street Pedestrian Crossing Safety Improvements

This pedestrian safety project consists of the construction of a refuge island and rectangular rapid flashing beacons at the intersection of Caldwell Avenue and Cleveland Street. The final design contract is underway. The project team continues to work with IDOT to obtain approval. The project will break ground in the spring of 2023, subject to receiving the necessary IDOT approvals.

Oakton Street Multi-Use Trail

This two-stage pedestrian project consists of a multimodal trail from Caldwell Avenue and Oakton Street to I-94. IDOT is expected to award the construction contract for stage 1 (west of Lehigh) of this multi-jurisdictional project in the near future and construction will then follow.

Greenleaf Sewer Repair

This sewer repair project to remedy a poorly performing sewer in the Chesterfield subdivision is substantially complete.

Milwaukee Avenue and Waukegan Road Street Lighting Replacement

The project is substantially complete. Final punch-list work and system turnover is ongoing.

Pace Pulse

Pace began construction on the Pulse Dempster line this summer. Station construction will continue through the fall and carry over to spring 2023.

North Branch Trail Connection – Bunker Hill

This bicycle and pedestrian project consists of a bike trail connection from the North Branch Trail in Bunker Hill Forest Preserve to the Touhy Triangle, along with gateway signage *(pictured below)* at Caldwell and Touhy. The project will be bid this fall with construction to start in spring 2023.





Golf Mill Town Center Redevelopment

The Village has been working with the Sterling Organization on the redevelopment plans for Golf Mill Town Center (rendering pictured above). The Village Board approved an inducement resolution with the Sterling Organization at the July 26 Village Board meeting to provide funding for the Village's costs and the developer's costs prior to a formal redevelopment agreement. Mayor Alpogianis and Economic Development Director John Melaniphy met with a group of hotel developers regarding the market study that was prepared for the Village for the Golf Mill redevelopment. The hotel developers recently developed new hotels in downtown Skokie and at Navy Pier.

The Sterling Organization envisions a masterplanned, mixed-use development featuring retail, restaurant, hotel, medical office, residential and entertainment uses on the property. The Village's tax increment financing (TIF) consultant completed their evaluation of the likely TIF incentives required for the redevelopment. The Village plans to have an "open house" meeting at the mall in the future to allow residents to review the Golf Mill Town Center redevelopment plans with the developers and Village staff.

Costco

The Village Board approved a Purchase and Sale Agreement and Redevelopment Agreement for Costco to purchase three acres of the former Grainger property that is owned by the Village. Costco had already leased a portion of the Grainger parking lot for employee parking. The Village Board's objective is to solve Costco's employee parking deficiency and retain Costco for many years into the future.



Starbucks Coffee

Phillips Edison, the owners of Oak Mill Mall, are developing a 4,721-square-foot multi-tenant retail building anchored by Starbucks Coffee in front of Jewel-Osco on the southwest corner of Milwaukee Avenue and Oakton Street. Construction started in mid-August and should be completed later this year. (Site plan pictured below).



Dempster Plaza

Newcastle Properties is planning to undertake a complete façade renovation program at the shopping center anchored by Jewel-Osco and Home Depot at Dempster Plaza, located at Dempster and Greenwood. There are also plans to add a new freestanding Starbucks Coffee on the pad of the shopping center in front of Jewel-Osco.

Cine Lounge Movie Theater

Economic Development staff met with Cine Lounge Movie Theater regarding their planned location at 9180 W. Golf Road in the Golf Glen Mart shopping center in the former Movie Max Cinemas space. Cine Lounge Movie Theater signed a lease and plans to open in the coming months following renovation of the space.

Dunkin' Donuts

A new Dunkin' Donuts will open in September at 8584 W. Dempster Street on the site of the former Bakers Square Restaurant. The Bakers Square Restaurant had been vacant for several years and was razed for redevelopment. Dunkin' Donuts worked with Economic Development and Community Development staff to redevelop the site.

Crumbl Cookies

Crumbl Cookies is opening a store in Niles. The new store is located adjacent to Melt n Dip and Poke Bros. at Pointe Plaza on Touhy Avenue. Crumbl Cookies plans to open in late October

this year. Each week, the menu rotates to give the customer four to five different specialty flavors to taste and enjoy. Crumbl chocolate chips are available all the time. There are already over 500 Crumbl locations across the country.



Deli-4-You

The owners of Deli-4-You grocery store provided an updated timeline for the store opening at Golf Milwaukee Plaza (*pictured below*). Deli-4-You plans to open around December 2022 or January 2023. Economic Development staff plans to coordinate a ribbon cutting when appropriate. Deli-4-You has locations in Algonquin, Norridge, Prospect Heights and Schaumburg.



The Dog House

The Dog House, located at 7254 N. Milwaukee, is now open for business. The Village approved a Cook County Class 7a classification for the property. The owner of the property invested approximately \$300,000 in improvements to the vacant former Skokie Automotive property. The Dog House is located immediately south of the Niles Animal Hospital, which will create synergies for dog owners.

9201 N. Milwaukee

Nea Maya Development closed on the property and is moving forward with a mixed-use residential and retail development, which will include a 48unit apartment building with ground floor retail space.

Hesco

Village staff met with T2 Investments regarding their plans to develop approximately 240 luxury apartment units at the former Hesco property at 6633 N. Milwaukee Avenue. The developer is planning to provide a swimming pool and rooftop amenities to differentiate the project from competitive facilities. Plans will be reviewed by Village staff.

Cook County Class 6b

The Village Board and Finance Committee voted to approve a Cook County Class 6b Classification for Imbibe, specialists in creating beverages, flavors, and ingredients. Imbibe plans to create a corporate campus at the three properties and invest \$4,000,000. The Village is assisting Imbibe with their growth objectives, which will expand employment from approximately 100 employees to 160 employees over the next few years.

ICSC Convention

Economic Development staff and the Village Manager attended the ICSC shopping center convention in May, conducting over 30 meetings with various retailers or their brokers. These meetings play a large role in drawing new businesses to Niles. Director Melaniphy also spoke at the annual brokers meeting at Mid-America Real Estate Corporation in April.

Other Developments

- The contract purchaser of the YMCA site is in the midst of their due diligence. They have not yet submitted plans for the property to the Village, but they remain in dialogue with Village staff about potential uses for the site.
- There have been discussions with a developer to purchase the Village-owned former Byline Bank site and the other properties on the northeast corner of Touhy and Harlem avenues for a major mixed-use development.
- Maryville Academy purchased the vacant South School property at 6935 W. Touhy Avenue in May and plans to renovate the property and open a vocational school in the fall of 2023.
- The Village is planning major infrastructure and roadway improvements on Melvina Avenue, focusing on plans for the YMCA, former Grainger site and Costco. Improvements will include water, sewer and electrical lines, traffic control measures, streetscape improvements, landscaping and right of way dedications.
