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**RESOLUTION**

Providing for consideration of the joint resolution (H.J. Res. 7) relating to a national emergency declared by the President on March 13, 2020; providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 139) to require Executive agencies to submit to Congress a study of the impacts of expanded telework and remote work by agency employees

during the COVID–19 pandemic and a plan for the agency’s future use of telework and remote work, and for other purposes; providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 382) to terminate the public health emergency declared with respect to COVID–19; and providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 497) to eliminate the COVID–19 vaccine mandate on health care providers furnishing items and services under certain Federal health care programs.

1       *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it  
2 shall be in order to consider in the House the joint resolu-  
3 tion (H.J. Res. 7) relating to a national emergency de-  
4 clared by the President on March 13, 2020. All points of  
5 order against consideration of the joint resolution are  
6 waived. The joint resolution shall be considered as read.  
7 All points of order against provisions in the joint resolu-  
8 tion are waived. The previous question shall be considered  
9 as ordered on the joint resolution and on any amendment  
10 thereto to final passage without intervening motion except:  
11 (1) one hour of debate equally divided and controlled by  
12 the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee  
13 on Transportation and Infrastructure or their respective  
14 designees; and (2) one motion to recommit.

15       SEC. 2. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be  
16 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 139) to  
17 require Executive agencies to submit to Congress a study  
18 of the impacts of expanded telework and remote work by

1 agency employees during the COVID–19 pandemic and a  
2 plan for the agency’s future use of telework and remote  
3 work, and for other purposes. All points of order against  
4 consideration of the bill are waived. The bill shall be con-  
5 sidered as read. All points of order against provisions in  
6 the bill are waived. The previous question shall be consid-  
7 ered as ordered on the bill and on any amendment thereto  
8 to final passage without intervening motion except: (1) one  
9 hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair  
10 and ranking minority member of the Committee on Over-  
11 sight and Accountability or their respective designees; and  
12 (2) one motion to recommit.

14 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 382) to  
15 terminate the public health emergency declared with re-  
16 spect to COVID–19. All points of order against consider-  
17 ation of the bill are waived. The bill shall be considered  
18 as read. All points of order against provisions in the bill  
19 are waived. The previous question shall be considered as  
20 ordered on the bill and on any amendment thereto to final  
21 passage without intervening motion except: (1) one hour  
22 of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair and  
23 ranking minority member of the Committee on Energy  
24 and Commerce or their respective designees; and (2) one  
25 motion to recommit.

1        SEC. 4. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be  
2 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 497) to  
3 eliminate the COVID–19 vaccine mandate on health care  
4 providers furnishing items and services under certain Fed-  
5 eral health care programs. All points of order against con-  
6 sideration of the bill are waived. The bill shall be consid-  
7 ered as read. All points of order against provisions in the  
8 bill are waived. The previous question shall be considered  
9 as ordered on the bill and on any amendment thereto to  
10 final passage without intervening motion except: (1) one  
11 hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair  
12 and ranking minority member of the Committee on En-  
13 ergy and Commerce or their respective designees; and (2)  
14 one motion to recommit.
