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EMPLOYER COSTS FOR EMPLOYEE COMPENSATION – MARCH 2021

Employer costs for employee compensation for **civilian** workers averaged \$39.01 per hour worked in March 2021, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported today. Wages and salaries cost employers \$26.84 while benefit costs were \$12.18. Total compensation costs for civilian workers were \$14.10 at the 10th wage percentile, \$29.36 at the 50th (median) wage percentile, and \$75.88 at the 90th wage percentile. (See charts 1 and 2, and tables A and 1.)

State and local government worker compensation costs for employers averaged \$53.68 per hour worked in March 2021. Wages and salaries averaged \$33.20 and accounted for 61.9 percent of employer costs, while benefit costs averaged \$20.47 and accounted for 38.1 percent. Total compensation costs for state and local government workers at the 50th (median) wage percentile were \$50.21. (See charts 1 and 2, and tables A and 1.)

Chart 1. Employer costs per employee hour worked, March 2021





Chart 2. Employer total compensation costs per employee hour worked by wage percentile, March 2021



Total employer compensation costs for **private industry** workers averaged \$36.64 per hour worked. Wages and salaries averaged \$25.80 per hour worked and accounted for 70.4 percent of employer costs. Benefit costs averaged \$10.83 per hour worked and accounted for the remaining 29.6 percent. Median (50th wage percentile) employer costs per employee hour worked were \$26.88 for total compensation, \$18.91 for wages and salaries, and \$7.97 for benefits. Total compensation costs for private industry workers ranged from \$13.46 per hour worked at the 10th wage percentile to \$71.99 at the 90th wage percentile. Wages and salaries were \$10.94 per hour worked at the 10th wage percentile and \$48.92 at the 90th wage percentile. Total benefit costs ranged from \$2.52 per hour worked at the 10th wage percentile to \$23.07 at the 90th wage percentile. (See chart 2 and table A.)

Metropolitan area private industry compensation costs are published each March reference period for the 15 largest Consolidated Statistical Areas (CSA) and Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSA). Total compensation costs in March 2021 for private industry workers ranged from \$31.34 per hour worked in the Miami-Fort Lauderdale-Port St. Lucie, FL CSA to \$55.47 per hour worked in the San Jose-San Francisco-Oakland, CA CSA. Coronavirus (COVID-19) Pandemic Impact on March 2021 ECEC Data

The Employer Costs for Employee Compensation (ECEC) reference date was March 12, 2021. Response rates for March were comparable with prior releases, and no changes in estimation procedures were necessary. Additional information is available at www.bls.gov/covid19/home.htm.

TECHNICAL NOTE

Employer Costs for Employee Compensation (ECEC), a product of the National Compensation Survey, provides the average employer cost for wages and salaries as well as benefits per employee hour worked. The ECEC covers the civilian economy, which includes data from both private industry and state and local government. Excluded from private industry are the self-employed, agricultural workers, and private household workers. Federal government workers are excluded from the public sector.

Total benefit costs consist of five major categories and include 18 benefit costs:

- Paid leave vacation, holiday, sick, and personal leave;
- Supplemental pay overtime and premium, shift differentials, and nonproduction bonuses;
- Insurance life, health, short-term and long-term disability;
- Retirement and savings defined benefit and defined contribution; and
- Legally required benefits Social Security (refers to Old-Age, Survivors, and Disability Insurance (OASDI) program), Medicare, federal and state unemployment insurance, and Workers' Compensation.

All workers are included in the benefit cost estimates including those that do not have plan access or do not participate. Costs are also affected by other factors such as cost sharing between employers and employees, plan features, and plan generosity. <u>Sample size</u>: Data for this reference period were collected from a probability sample of approximately 24,300 occupational observations selected from a sample of about 6,000 private industry establishments and approximately 7,700 occupational observations selected from a sample of about 1,400 state and local government establishments that provided data at the initial interview.

<u>Measures of reliability</u>: Relative standard errors (RSEs) provide users a tool to ascertain the quality of an estimate to ensure that it is within an acceptable range for their intended purpose. RSEs are available at www.bls.gov/ncs/ect/ecec-rse.htm and database query tool at www.bls.gov/ncs/ect/data.htm.

<u>Comparisons</u>: Compensation cost levels in state and local government should not be directly compared with levels in private industry. Differences between these sectors stem from factors such as variation in work activities and occupational structures.
