

# INDEPENDENT FILMS TAKE HOME 8 WINS AT 96TH ACADEMY AWARDS INCLUDING BEST ORIGINAL SCREENPLAY, BEST ADAPTED SCREENPLAY, AND BEST ANIMATED FEATURE

Los Angeles, CA - March 11, 2024 – Independent films had an incredible night at the 2024 Academy Awards taking home 8 wins in 20 of the feature categories, the Independent Film & Television Alliance (IFTA) is pleased to announce. Oscar winners *American Fiction, Anatomy of a Fall, The Boy and the Heron, The Holdovers, Godzilla Minus One, The Zone of Interest* and *20 Days in Mariupol* are all independent having been financed, produced and sold territory-by-territory outside of the major Hollywood studios.

A total of 20 Independent films had earned Academy Award nominations this year in feature-length motion picture categories with a combined 37 nominations. IFTA Members CJ ENM, Miramax, Pathé, and Film UA were among the companies involved in the production, financing, sales and/or distribution of this year's nominees, with Miramax earning an Oscar win for *The Holdovers* in the category of Supporting Actress.
