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## REQUEST FOR COMMENT ON PETITION FOR RULEMAKING BY T-MOBILE USA, INC., REGARDING CONTINUED USE OF ASCII FORMAT FOR TTY-BASED RELAY SERVICE

Pursuant to section 1.403 of the rules,¹ the Consumer and Governmental Affairs Bureau (CGB or Bureau) of the Federal Communications Commission (Commission) seeks comment on a Petition for Rulemaking filed by T-Mobile USA, Inc., (T-Mobile) on behalf of Sprint Communications Company L.P. (collectively, "T-Mobile Accessibility").² T-Mobile Accessibility provides state and federal relay services supported by the Interstate Telecommunications Relay Services (TRS) Fund. T-Mobile requests that the Commission amend section 64.604(b)(1) of its rules by deleting references to the American Standard Code for Information Interchange (ASCII) format in the rule, on the grounds that the requirement that TTY-based relay service be capable of communicating with ASCII format has outlived its utility.³

Filing Requirements. Interested parties may file comments on T-Mobile's Petition on or before the dates indicated on the first page of this document.<sup>4</sup> All filings must reference CG Docket No. 03-123. Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS).<sup>5</sup>

- Paper Filers:
  - Parties who choose to file by paper must file an original and one copy of each filing. If more than one docket or rulemaking number appears in the caption of this proceeding,

filers must submit two additional copies for each additional docket or rulemaking number.

- o Filings can be sent by hand or messenger delivery, by commercial overnight courier, or by first-class or overnight U.S. Postal Service mail. All filings must be addressed to the Commission's Secretary, Office of the Secretary, Federal Communications Commission.
- Currently, the Commission does not accept any hand delivered or messenger delivered filings as a temporary measure taken to help protect the health and safety of individuals, and to mitigate the transmission of COVID-19. In the event that the Commission announces the lifting of COVID-19 restrictions, a filing window will be opened at the Commission's office located at 9050 Junction Drive, Annapolis Junction, Maryland 20701.6

Ex Parte Requirements. The proceeding this Notice initiates shall be treated as a "permit-butdisclose" proceeding in accordance with the Commission's ex parte rules.<sup>7</sup> Persons making ex parte presentations must file a copy of any written presentation or a memorandum summarizing any oral presentation within two business days after the presentation (unless a different deadline applicable to the Sunshine period applies). Persons making oral ex parte presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentation must (1) list all persons attending or otherwise participating in the meeting at which the ex parte presentation was made, and (2) summarize all data presented and arguments made during the presentation. If the presentation consisted in whole or in part of the presentation of data or arguments already reflected in the presenter's written comments, memoranda or other filings in the proceeding, the presenter may provide citations to such data or arguments in his or her prior comments, memoranda, or other filings (specifying the relevant page and/or paragraph numbers where such data or arguments can be found) in lieu of summarizing them in the memorandum. Documents shown or given to Commission staff during ex parte meetings are deemed to be written ex parte presentations and must be filed consistent with rule 1.1206(b). In proceedings governed by rule 1.49(f) or for which the Commission has made available a method of electronic filing, written ex parte presentations and memoranda summarizing oral ex parte presentations, and all attachments thereto, must be filed through the electronic comment filing system available for that proceeding, and must be filed in their native format (e.g., .doc, .xml, .ppt, searchable .pdf). Participants in this proceeding should familiarize themselves with the Commission's ex parte rules.
