Applications opened today, Monday 30 January, for the Australian grape and wine sector's flagship leadership development program Future Leaders.

Future Leaders inspires a new generation of leaders wanting to achieve impactful change at a personal, business and sector level.

The program connects participants with highly engaging facilitators and distinguished speakers that create long-lasting behaviour change. It supports participants to sharpen decision-making abilities, build networks and enthusiasm to take the grape and wine community forward into tomorrow.

Wine Australia Senior R&D Program Manager and Future Leaders coordinator Jo Hargreaves said challenges over the past few years have shown how fundamental innovation is in leadership.

"The Future Leaders program has continued to evolve over the years, and the program has honed its focus on resilience and ingenuity in response," Ms Hargreaves said.

"Importantly, those selected to take part in the program are called on to find their voice, consider some of the sector's greatest challenges and opportunities, and be part of conversations designed to find the solutions we need.
