- Conduct a systematic study of the conditions impacting Black men and boys in civil rights, criminal justice, education, labor and employment, and housing and health.
- Examine trends regarding Black males and report on the community effects of relevant government programs within the scope of above topics.
- Propose measures to alleviate and remedy underlying causes of conditions described in the statute via an annual report which may include law change recommendations, policy recommendations, and guidance to Congress and the President of the United States.
