Request

Can you provide by year covering the 1 April 2018 to 30 September 2023, a table or data of suicides registered in Northern Ireland, with the table or data disaggregated by (a) the country of birth of the deceased, (b) their age and (c) if possible, the local authority area of the suicide.

Response

I can confirm that the Department holds some of the information requested.

The Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency (NISRA) produces statistics based on the cause of death information recorded on death certificates and collected by the General Register Office (GRO) during the death registration process.

Please note that in the United Kingdom the National Statistics definition, in considering suicide events, includes cases where the <u>International Classification of Diseases 10th Revision (ICD-10)</u> are either X60-X84 and Y87.0 (Suicide and self-inflicted injury) or Y10-Y34 and Y87.2 (Event of Undetermined intent). Any data provided are based on the **year of registration** rather than the year of occurrence. Events such as suicide are referred to the coroner, and this process can take some time; therefore, deaths recorded each year may have occurred prior to the registration year.

Prior to the publication of the annual suicide statistics, NISRA carries out standard internal quality assurance data checks. Therefore, besides the total number of suicides by age grouping registered in 2022, already published in the Registrar general annual report, and the provisional (P) number of suicides by age grouping registered between January to June 2023, published in the registrar general quarterly report, any further disaggregation of the suicide statistics will not be available (n/a) until the suicide statistics 2022 and 2023 are published.
