Athens Transportation Partners, LLC ("ATP") submits this verified Notice of Exemption pursuant to 49 CFR § 1152.50 for an exempt abandonment of an approximately six and one-half mile long segment of rail line running from the northern end of the Oconee River trestle bridge in Athens-Clarke County at approximate milepost F-MP 98.8 (33°52'30.49"N, 83°21'28.11"W) to approximate milepost F-MP 105.3 (33°57'30.23"N, 83°22'14.95"W) in the north near East Broad Street in Athens, Clarke County, Georgia (the "ATP Line" or "Line").

Proposed Consummation Date (49 CFR § 1152.50(d)(2))

The ATP Line's abandonment will be consummated, at the earliest, on June 12, 2024, which is at least 50 days after filing this Notice of Exemption.

49 CFR § 1152.50(b) Certification

ATP certifies that no local or overhead traffic has moved over the Line for at least nine years. ATP further certifies that no formal complaint filed by a user of rail service on the Line (or a state or local government entity acting on behalf of such user) regarding cessation of service over the Line either is pending with the Surface Transportation Board (the "Board") or any U.S. District Court or has been decided in favor of the complainant within the last nine years.

Information Required by 49 CFR §§ 1152.22(a)(1)–(4), (7) and (8), and (e)(4)

(a) <u>General.</u>

- (1) The railroad's exact name is Athens Transportation Partners, LLC ("ATP").
- (2) ATP is a common carrier by railroad subject to 49 U.S.C. Subtitle IV, chapter 105.
- (3) ATP intends to abandon its Line, which runs from the northern end of the Oconee River trestle bridge in Athens-Clarke County at approximate milepost F-MP 98.8 (33°52'30.49"N, 83°21'28.11"W) to approximate milepost F-MP 105.3 (33°57'30.23"N, 83°22'14.95"W) in the north near East Broad Street in Athens, Clarke County, Georgia. Prior to ATP's acquisition of the Line, service over the Line had been discontinued by the prior owner.
- (4) A map showing the exact location of the rail line to be abandoned and its relation to other rail lines in the area, highways, water routes, and population centers is attached as Exhibit B. As shown in Exhibit B: (1) in 1988, service was discontinued from F-MP 75.5 (near Madison, Georgia) to F-MP 91.5 (Bishop, Georgia); and (2) in 2019, service was discontinued from F-MP 91.5 (Bishop, Georgia) to F-MP 105.3 (the northern terminus of the Line).

(8) The Line traverses U.S. Postal Service Zip Codes 30601, 30602, and 30605.

- (e) <u>Rural and community impact.</u>
 - (4) As explained in ATP's Combined Environmental and Historic Report at 4 (filed with the Board on April 18, 2024), if the Line is abandoned, the Line's right-of-way is likely to be transferred to the University of Georgia, which is developing plans to utilize the right-ofway as a connectivity corridor that would incorporate bus rapid transit, pedestrian, and bike uses that would be open to public use. The right-of-way would not be available for other public use.

ATP has fee simple ownership of the property underlying the Line's right-of-way, except for at least¹ three sections of the right-of-way where the Line crosses former Cemetery Street, Baldwin Street, and Mitchell Street (formerly Factory Street) in Athens, Georgia. *See* Exhibit C. When ATP purchased the Line in 2019, it assumed the right to cross these streets for "railroad purposes." *See* Exhibit D. How this limitation on the use of these crossings would affect the transfer of title or the use of property for other than rail purposes has not been determined. ATP is not aware of any other restriction, including any reversionary interest, on the title to the property underlying the ATP Line.

Labor Protection

ATP believes no employees will be adversely affected by abandonment, as the Line has been out of service for at least nine years. However, as a condition of the Board's abandonment authority, ATP will accept the standard labor protection conditions as set forth in *Oregon Short Line R. Co – Abandonment – Goshen*, 360 I.C.C. 91 (1979).

¹ The 2019 ATP Boundary Survey (attached as Exhibit C) also suggests there is a break in ATP's property ownership as the Line crosses the Oconee Street underpass in Athens. ATP does not have in its possession any agreement that clarifies any property ownership at the Oconee Street crossing.

Certifications

Included in Exhibit E are Certificates of Notice, Service, and Publication, pursuant to the requirements of 49 CFR §§ 1152.50(d)(1), 1105.11, and 1105.12.

Environmental and Historic Report

A copy of the cover letter which accompanied ATP's Combined Environmental and Historic Report ("CEHR"), containing the information required by 49 CFR §§ 1105.7(e) and 1105.8, and served in accordance with 49 CFR § 1105.11, is attached as Exhibit F. The CEHR was filed with the Board on April 18, 2024. On April 8, 2024, ATP received an email (attached as Exhibit G) from the Northeast Georgia Regional Commission (NGRC) stating that the University of Georgia's potential use of the right-of-way post-abandonment "aligns with what our office included in our assessment as a potential future use." NGRC also stated it "[does] not have anything to add regarding the U.S. Surface Transportation Board's review." ATP has received no other comments on the CEHR.








EXHIBIT C 2019 ATP Boundary Survey

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

EXHIBIT "D"

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Athens, Sectioni- 1 That the right of way be and is hereby granted to the Covington and Escon Railroad Company to lay its track across Cemetary Street, Ballwin Street, Factory Street, Thomas Street, Broad Street, thence into and through Hickory street, in a northerly direction, to and ereasing Strong street, Bridge Street, Youndary skreet, the alley between Foundary Street and River street, crossing River street, Hoyt Street and Vollege Avenue, with the right to make the necessary cuts, trestles, turnouts, switches, etc., and to use and occupy said right of way forever for railroad purposes as shown by the plat hereto attached, which is made apart of this Ordinance for a more complete description of said crossing?, tarnouts, switches, etc., provided that no more than is necessary for a road bed shall be taken for a road bed where a single or double track is laid; and provided further that no side tracks, turnouts, stc., shall be laid where the main track runs through or along a street.

Section 2- It shall be the duty of the said Covington and Magon Railroad Company to make and keep in repairs the necessary crossings and bridges for public travel along the Streets and side walks, ever which or through which these tracks, side tracks, turneuts, etc., may be laid, and all bridges to be the full width of the street and side walk unless by special consent of the Mayor and Council.

Section 3- Nothing in this ordinance shall be construed to interfere with the rights of private individuals or other persons who may be affected by the passage; nor to interfere with the City's action over and against said Comington and Macon Railroad Company, in the event that said City shall be held liable for allowing the right herein granted, nor to interfere with the right of the authoritiescef said City to pass such police ordinances and regulations in the future, concerning said Covington and Macon Railroad Company as said authorities shall deem necessary for the safety and welfare of maid City.

Section 4- This ordinance shall take effect when the said Covington and Macon Railroad Company shall file in the office of the Clerk of Council, its written acceptance of the terms and conditions herein set forth.

Council then adjourned.

Mr. Cunningham,

I am in receipt of your environmental notice regarding the abandonment of a segment of the Athens rail line (AB 1332_0_X). I would like to note that this corridor is identified as a Regionally Important Resource (RIR) in the Northeast Georgia Resource Management Plan, adopted in 2018 (see attached). The resource description is included on page 29. The RIR Plan does not impose any environmental requirements other than for the resource to be considered in Developments of Regional Impact (DRI) reviews and regional and local planning documents. Per the description of what UGA intends to do post-abandonment, using the corridor for multi-modal purposes aligns with what our office included in our assessment as a potential future use.

Regarding Development of Regional Impact reviews, the potential future actions by UGA listed in the Environmental Report part 1.3.iv. would not require a DRI review per the State thresholds.

For the action of abandonment on this section of the rail line, I do not have any thing to add regarding the U.S. Surface Transportation Board's review. My comments are directed to you for informational purposes.
