Fair Fortune! \$1 Million CA Lottery Ticket Sold at the OC Fair

SACRAMENTO – A California Lottery player appears to have struck it rich at the Orange County Fair this week, scratching off to a \$1 million prize spot after buying a *Multiplier Craze* Scratchers® ticket. The winning ticket was sold at the <u>CA Lottery LIVE!</u> booth which is operated as a partnership between the California Lottery and a Lucky Retailer each year. The Lucky Retailer at this year's OC Fair is 5 Star Liquor from Westminster.

The California Lottery won't be able to officially declare a winner until the person who bought the winning Scratchers comes forward, but 5 Star Liquor owner Maysa Dagher said there was



a lot of excitement when the person played their newly purchased Multiplier Craze game.

"He actually came to the back window and said, 'I know I won something, but don't say anything aloud, and tell me if it is true," Dagher explained. She said her co-worker checked the ticket, too, and was excited about the sale.

Any winning player can come forward to claim their prize at one of <u>nine California Lottery</u> <u>offices</u> or by <u>mailing the ticket in</u>.

The CA Lottery LIVE! booth, known for its vibrant and lively atmosphere, has become a favorite spot for fairgoers. "People actually spend the day here. They check us out; we are loud and crazy in here," Dagher said.
