Oil Spill Incident in Watercourse at Pointe aux Sables

- 1. This Ministry has been notified at around 10:00hrs on Tuesday 02 July 2024 of presence of oil in a watercourse located next to the Pointe aux Sables Public Beach. As per preliminary investigation, an estimated amount of 20 litres of Heavy Fuel Oil (HFO) has been spilled.
- 2. Upon notification of the oil spill incident, a team of officers from this Ministry, *Police de L'Environnement*, Special Mobile Force (SMF) and National Coast Guard (NCG) immediately proceeded on-site, where two patches of oil of an area of about 10 m² were observed near the bridge and along the banks of the watercourse upstream. There is no oil observed in the lagoon.
- 3. The Ministry of Blue Economy, Marine Resources, Fisheries and Shipping; Water Resources Unit; Forestry Service; City Council of Port Louis; Beach Authority; Mauritius Ports Authority; and Solid Waste Management Division, were immediately notified of the oil spill by this Ministry for necessary actions at their level.
- 4. To contain the oil, the NCG and SMF have deployed a total of 21 metres sorbent booms and some 160 sorbent pads in the spilled area.
- 5. Water samples have been collected by the National Environmental Laboratory (NEL) both in the watercourse and at sea for analysis; and ambient air screening exercise is also being carried out to detect the presence of Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs) in the neighbourhood of the oil spill incident.
- 6. As per preliminary enquiry, the spill occurred from one of the garment factories in Pointe aux Sables.
- 7. The situation is under control.
