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Sibley Boulevard at Halsted Street traffic signal improvement project begins Sept. 30

CHICAGO – The Illinois Department of Transportation announced today that a project to upgrade the traffic signals at the intersection of Sibley Boulevard (Illinois 83) and Halsted Street (Illinois 1), in Harvey, will require daytime intermittent lane closures beginning, weather permitting, Monday, Sept. 30.

The \$1.9 million project, which also includes constructing new ADA-compliant sidewalk ramps, is expected to be completed in summer 2025.

The public can expect delays and should allow extra time for trips through this area. Alternative routes are encouraged. Drivers are urged to pay close attention to flaggers and signs in the work zones, obey the posted speed limits and be on the alert for workers and equipment.

Over the [next six years](#), IDOT is planning to improve more than 3,200 miles of highway and nearly 9 million square feet of bridge deck as part of Rebuild Illinois, which is investing \$33.2 billion into all modes of transportation. [Accomplishments](#) through Year Five of Rebuild Illinois include approximately \$16 billion of improvements statewide on 6,541 miles of highway, 686 bridges and 986 additional safety improvements.
