Local Impact:

- The westbound lane on W. Bryn Mawr between N. Broadway and N. Winthrop Avenue will be closed and no westbound traffic permitted.
- The parking lane(s) within the work zone will be closed.
- The sidewalk on the north side of W. Bryn Mawr Avenue within the work zone will be
- The sidewalk on the south side of W. Bryn Mawr Avenue will remain open at all times.
- Work will require two (2) water shut-offs impacting adjacent properties of the 1100 block of W. Bryn Mawr Avenue. Impacts will be communicated by Department of Water Management at least 24 hours in advance.
- Access to the alley north of W. Bryn Mawr Avenue on the east side of the CTA Tracks will be maintained via W. Hollywood Avenue.
- Access to businesses will be maintained at all times.
- Access to the Bryn Mawr station entrance will be maintained at all times.
- There will be noise while work is being performed. Noise will include:
 - General construction noise
 - Loud noise from roadway demolition
 - Beeping from backup alarms on construction vehicles and equipment
