
K-99 crack sealing project begins soon

On Thursday, Nov. 7, the Kansas Department of Transportation expects to begin a crack sealing project on K-99 in Elk and Greenwood counties. The project area extends from U.S. 160 north for 18.6 miles to U.S. 400.

Flaggers and a pilot car will guide one-lane traffic through the work zone; expect delays of 15 minutes or less. Weather permitting, the road work should be finished by early December.

KDOT awarded Pavement Pro's, McPherson, the \$73,825 construction contract. KDOT urges motorists to stay alert and follow posted signs in all work zones.
