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Overnight I-435 project work to start Monday in Johnson County

On Monday, July 29, a Kansas Department of Transportation pavement marking project will begin in Johnson County, weather permitting.

The project will include all eastbound and westbound I-435 lanes and ramps from Metcalf Avenue to State Line Road. Message boards are in place notifying motorists of upcoming project work and closures.

To minimize impacts to traffic, work is scheduled overnight, Monday through Friday.


For the duration of the project, eastbound and westbound I-435 will be reduced to one lane in areas where work is taking place and short-term ramp closures will be scheduled at the Metcalf Avenue, Nall Avenue, Roe Avenue and State Line Road entrance and exit ramps.

Traffic will be controlled using portable message signs, signage, arrow boards and traffic cones.

Heartland Traffic Services, of Kansas City, is the contractor for the \$781,600 project, expected to be completed in late September.
