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K-246 resurfacing work to begin tomorrow

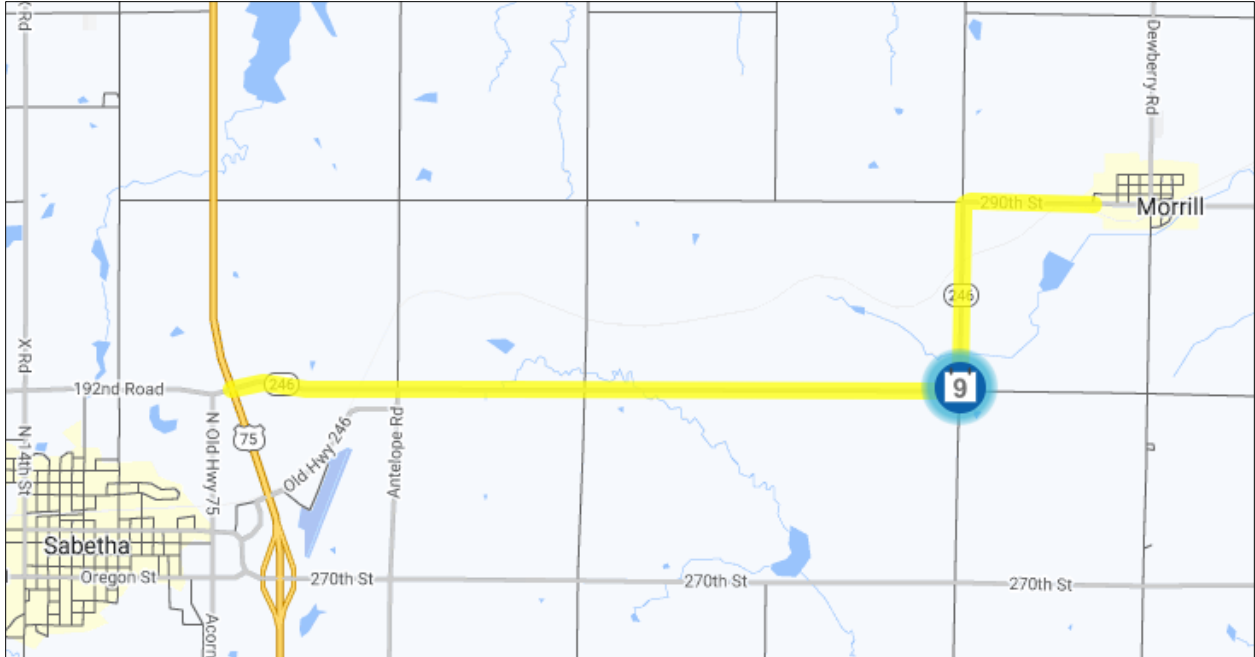
A Kansas Department of Transportation mill and overlay project is scheduled to begin on K-246 in Brown County tomorrow, Oct. 9, conditions permitting. The 5-mile project spans from the U.S. 75 junction to the western city limit of Morrill.

Traffic will be restricted to one lane and directed by a pilot car and flaggers where crews actively are working. Drivers should plan for delays of up to 15 minutes.

Work will take place Monday through Friday during daylight hours and is expected to be complete in early November.

Hall Brothers Inc., of Marysville, is the prime contractor on the \$1.3 million project.
