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U.S. 160 resurfacing work begins this week

Wednesday, Aug. 28, the Kansas Department of Transportation expects to start resurfacing work on U.S. 160 in Montgomery County. The chip seal project begins at the west junction of U.S. 160/U.S. 75 and continues west for 15 miles to the Montgomery/Elk county line.

Flaggers and a pilot car will direct one-lane traffic through the work zone during daylight hours; expect delays of 15 minutes or less. Weather permitting, the work should be finished in early September.

KDOT awarded the construction contract to Vance Brothers Inc. and Subsidiary, Kansas City, Missouri.
