AG Fitch Announces Four Arrests from Cyber Operation Cold Turkey

(Jackson, Mississippi) Attorney General Lynn Fitch today announced the completion of a weeklong cybercrime operation known as Operation Cold Turkey that led to the arrest of four individuals on charges related to child exploitation.

"Throughout this operation, we were able to remove dangerous predators from communities in Mississippi and prevent them from doing further harm," **said Attorney General Lynn Fitch**. "I am grateful to the dedicated investigators and prosecutors from the Attorney General's Office and to our partners in local, state, and federal law enforcement for their work on this operation and every day to clear the Internet of child predators."

Operation Cold Turkey, which ran November 11 to 15, 2024, involved AGO investigators and partner law enforcement locating individuals attempting to lure children online to meet for sex or to send child pornography. Throughout the course of the operation, they served nine search warrants, made four arrests for child exploitation, and developed countless leads that may result in additional arrests.
