And statistical information is presented in a balanced and appropriate way. Notwithstanding the generally positive tone of the report, there is no attempt to hide uncomfortable facts.
Clarity	Professional writers and graphic designers have been tasked with communicating the information in a way that ordinary people can understand. The information is themed around the story of value creation and depletion. Noting that protecting value (or at least mitigating its depletion) is as important as creating value.
Comparability	Our operations in southern Africa account for 85% of ounces produced, 97% of the workforce and for the vast majority of ESG-related activities.  Therefore, the report must reflect a southern African - and more specifically a South African – bias. The report includes detailed information of how we compare, as against our past, and how we compare as against competitors and how we compare as against the global ESG standards of the day.  And we do not change the framework of our comparability, but endeavour to keep it consistent, from one year to the next. Precedent is important.
Verifiability	External assurance is provided across a range of key performance indicators.
Timeliness	The Integrated Report is published annually timeously as per the reporting guidelines which provides performance data to interested parties.
