

E. IMPORT OF SPORT-HUNTED BONTEBOK TROPHIES FROM SOUTH AFRICA

Note 1: If you hold an import permit for trophy/trophies that you did not use, please return the unused original permit to the address on page one.

Note 2: If you are requesting reissuance of a permit because you have taken a trophy, but were unable to import it prior to the expiration of the permit, please use the renewal form (3-200-52) and return your original permit with that form.

Note 3: The bontebok is listed as endangered under the Endangered Species Act. Applications for endangered species permits must be published in the Federal Register for a 30-day public comment period. Allow at least 90 days for the application to be processed.

Note 4: This application can only be used if you have hunted/will be hunting in South Africa. If you have or will be hunting in a different country, please use form 3-200-20.

Note 5: *Sport-hunted trophy* is defined at 50 CFR 23.74 as follows: *Sport-hunted trophy* means a whole dead animal or a readily recognizable part or derivative of an animal specifically identified on the accompanying CITES document that meets the following criteria:

- Is raw, processed, or manufactured;
- Was legally obtained by the hunter through hunting for his or her personal use;
- Is being imported, exported, or re-exported by or on behalf of the hunter as part of the transfer from its country of origin ultimately to the hunter's country of usual residence; and
- May include worked, manufactured, or handicraft items made from the sport-hunted animal only when:
 - i. Such items are contained in the same shipment as raw or tanned parts of the sport-hunted animal and are for the personal use of the hunter;
 - ii. The quantity of such items is no more than could reasonably be expected given the number of animals taken by the hunter as shown on the license or other documentation of the authorized hunt accompanying the shipment; and
 - iii. The accompanying CITES documents (export document and, if appropriate, import permit) contain a complete itemization and description of all items included in the shipment.

If you are not exporting the trophy from South Africa directly to the United States, you will need to obtain a CITES re-export certificate from the re-exporting country.

Customs Rules on Discharge of Importers Liability for Duties

The U.S. Customs Service has issued a final amendment of the regulations to provide an alternative procedure for an importer record to pay duties on imported merchandise through a licensed customhouse broker. Present rules provide for the payment of duties to Customs by a broker on behalf of the importer. Under the alternative procedure, the importer may elect to submit to the broker a separate check or bank draft for the duties payable to the "U.S. Customs Service". The broker would then deliver the importer's check or bank draft to Customs. The new rule also requires brokers to provide written notification to their clients, advising that if the client is an importer of record, payment to the broker will not relieve the client of liability for Customs charges in the event that the charges are not paid by the broker. Brokers will be required to provide this notification to all active clients annually during the month of February. Additionally, brokers will be required to provide such information on a power of attorney executed on or after the effective date of the new rule. These amendments are effective as of September 27, 1982.

It is a private herd which was started from stock purchased in 1991. These Bontebok were inspected on 1st December 1992 and certified "pure". In 2011 the Bontebok were DNA tested, again to be found "pure". Since 2011, every year we continue to DNA Test these Bontebok on Kasouga farm and have always found them "pure".

The ram is a lone bachelor & its removal has no negative impact on the rest of the herd. Through the surveys in 2016 & 2017. +/- 50% of the calves are born MALE, and the ratio of a breeding group is anything from 1 dominate male with 7 – 15 females. Which then leads to a surplus of males. These surveys show that "pure Bontebok" in South Africa are stable & certainly not threatened.

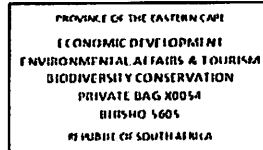

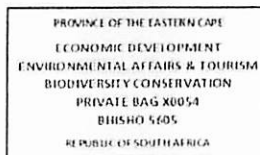

2. Consideration of future applications will be based on, among other things, whether any permit issued to the landowner of the registered game farm / wildlife trader has been cancelled in terms of section 93 of the Biodiversity Act.
3. No listed species may be transported without the necessary permits in terms of the Threatened or Protected Species Regulations.
4. Provide information, relating to security measures to prevent theft, with each renewal.
5. The game farm/s must be fenced in accordance with the specifications provided for in provincial legislation and the Certificate of Adequate Enclosure must be renewed at least 3 months prior to the expiry thereof.
6. The landowner of the registered game farm must RETURN ALL THE COPIES of the Game Farm Hunting permits USED DURING A 12-MONTH PERIOD to the issuing authority; and must submit a list of any unused permit numbers to the issuing authority.
7. The permit holder may apply for game farm hunting permits, authorising a person to buy and hunt a listed threatened or protected species, on the registered game farm and for the subsequent transport and possession of the dead specimen/s that was hunted.
8. The permit holder must give regard to any other applicable legislation and/or protocols.
9. The permit holder must keep a register of past, current and anticipated turnover of stock on an annual basis.



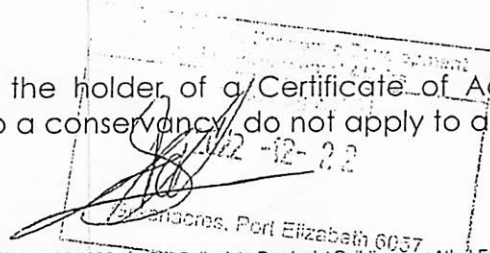

**RE: PERMIT TO HUNT WILD ANIMALS IN THE KOWIE-KARIEGA CONSERVANCY:
PERMIT NO.: CRO 80/22CR**

In terms of Section 27 of the Nature and Environmental Conservation Ordinance (Ordinance 19 of 1974) the members of the Kowie-Kariega Conservancy are granted permission to hunt wild animals on their properties as stipulated in attached Addendum.

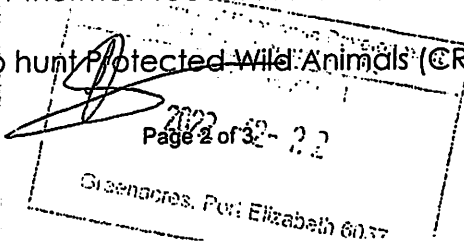
Note the following conditions:

1. The approval allows members of the conservancy to deviate from the Hunting Seasons and Bag Limits described in the 2022 Provincial Hunting Proclamation. The numbers of animals listed in the Addendum may thus be hunted during the period 01 January 2023 to 31 December 2023.
2. Professional hunters and their clients must apply for a permit(s) when they want to hunt within the conservancy but outside the proclaimed Hunting Season. This permit will be issued in the hunter's name and the number of animals hunted will be deducted from the number of animals approved. They also need a permit for any species where there is no proclaimed Hunting Season.
3. In reference to Paragraph 2, written permission must be obtained from the owner of a particular property before any hunting takes place.
4. In the case of Professional hunters and their clients, permit(s) must be applied for at least 14 (fourteen) working days before any hunt.
5. Hunts may not take place if hunters do not have the necessary permits in their possession.
6. The privileges of the holder of a Certificate of Adequate Enclosure, which presently apply to a conservancy do not apply to any species held in captivity



within the conservancy. Captive animals may only be hunted / removed by means of a separate permit issued by this Department.

7. No animal may be hunted by a foreign client where it is deemed to be in captivity.
8. The hunting of birds should follow the Hunting Season and Bag Limits prescribed in the 2022 Provincial Hunting Proclamation.
9. The numbers of animals stipulated in the Addendum are for the period 01 January 2023 to 31 December 2023 and include those animals shot in the Hunting Season (if applicable).
10. Members may not exceed their Bag Limits for ungulates before this Department has approved the increase.
11. The species Blue Duiker (*Philantomba monticola*), Bontebok (*Damaliscus pygargus pygargus*), Oribi (*Ourebia ourebi*) and Common Reedbuck (*Redunca arundinum*) are excluded from the quota, as they are TOPS. It must be noted that: Under the Threatened or Protected Species (TOPS) Regulations promulgated in terms of Section 57 of the National Environmental Management Biodiversity Act (No. 10 of 2004), the Conservancy must apply for permits from their nearest Departmental Office within 21 (twenty-one) working days before any hunt. However, a separate In-Principle approval was granted for them.
12. Members must report on and arrange all game removals (whether animals were hunted for trophies or biltong; culled; or captured) with / through the Secretary.
13. The Secretary must always have an absolute total of removals , whether hunted, captured or culled.
14. Details of any animal hunted must immediately be recorded on the prescribed Hunting Control Register (copy attached) and a copy must be forwarded with immediate effect to the office where the permit was issued in order to keep records updated for inspection purposes. The register must be available for inspection at any time. A copy of this register must accompany all permit applications made throughout the year.
15. A game count must be undertaken on the Conservancy as part of the planning exercise.
16. The following documents must be submitted to the Department together with your hunting requirements when applying for a permit renewal for 2023:
 - ❖ Copies of the Control Registers of all members who hunted during the year;
 - ❖ Copies of Progress Reports on their Five-Year Projects;
 - ❖ A copy of minutes of the most recent Annual General Meeting held by the conservancy;
 - ❖ The original Permit to hunt Protected Wild Animals (CRO 80/22CR);



- ❖ The original permit of any other PWAs hunted;
- ❖ Copies of any amendments to the Management Plan for the Conservancy; and
- ❖ Some clear indication must be given as to how many of each species will be hunted for trophies.

17. It is recommended that a long-term monitoring and risk management strategy is to be put in place for naturally occurring species (i.e. species within their distribution range). This is not limited to species for which hunting quotas are approved but may include other species of special concern within the conservancy. If such strategy exists, it is recommended that a progress report is submitted to the Department at the end of each year with the submission of a new quota request.

18. Issuing of further permits will depend upon the fulfillment of above conditions. Failure to adhere to the above conditions may result in the cancellation of this permit with immediate effect.

19. This Department reserves the right to modify these conditions if there are sound ecological, management and administrative reasons to do so.


