The Institute for Sustainable Communities' Thriving Communities Subgrants provide community-based nonprofits and other eligible subrecipients funding for assessment, planning, and project development activities. This competition is launched in alignment with the goals and objectives of two Executive Orders (EO 14008 and EO 13985) issued by the Biden Administration that demonstrate the EPA's and Administration's commitment to achieving environmental justice and embedding environmental justice into Agency programs.
