Verbal Comments

Phillip Cravat: Is this going to apply for homes before 1978?

Claire Brisse: The definition of target housing will still apply to pre-1978 housing, but we're removing an exception for zero-bedroom dwellings. The proposed rule conforms the definition to a statutory change

made in 2017 that got rid of that exception. For example, a studio apartment that had a child wouldn't previously have been included under the rule, but now it applies.

Written Comments

Tribes were given until September 15, 2023, to request a one-on-one consultation with EPA. The Agency received no requests, just a logistical question about when written comments would need to be submitted by. EPA also received no additional written comments or feedback from Tribes.
