On January 12, 2024, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) announced the proposed rulemaking "Waste Emissions Charge for Petroleum and Natural Gas Systems." The EPA is proposing this regulation to implement the requirements of Clean Air Act (CAA) section 136(c) through (g). Under CAA section 136, the EPA

is required to impose and collect an annual charge on methane emissions that exceed specified waste emissions levels from an owner or operator of an applicable facility that reports more than 25,000 metric tons of carbon dioxide equivalent of greenhouse gases emitted per year pursuant to the petroleum and natural gas systems source category requirements of the Greenhouse Gas Reporting Rule (codified as 40 CFR part 98, subpart W).

The EPA will be accepting public comments for 45 days after the publication date in the *Federal Register* at https://www.regulations.gov/, Docket ID No. EPA-HQ-OAR-2023-0434. The EPA, in the development of the final actions will consider all comments submitted during the public comment period.
