ground-level ozone has been shown in clinical and epidemiologial studies to have the following health effects:

- Decreased lung function, primarily in children active outdoors
- Increased respiratory symptoms, particularly in highly sensitive individuals
- Hospital admissions and emergency room visits for respiratory causes among children and adults with pre-existing respiratory disease such as asthma
- Inflammation of the lung

The new 8-hour primary ambient air quality standard (62)
TR 38856, July 18, 1997) will provide increased protection to the public from these health effects.

Each year, ground-level ozone above background is also responsible for several hundred million dollars worth of agricultural crop yield loss. It is estimated that full compliance with the newly promulgated ozone NAAQS will result in an additional \$500 million of prevented crop yield loss. Ozone also causes noticeable foliar damage in many
