Re: R24-15: NATIONAL AMBIENT AIR QUALITY STANDARDS, USEPA AMENDMENTS (July 1, 2023, through December 31, 2023)

Dear Ms. Shore:

Pursuant to Section 110(a)(2) of the Clean Air Act ("CAA") (42 U.S.C. §7410 (a)(2)) and Sections 7.2 and 10(H) of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (415 ILCS 5/7.2 and 10(H)), the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency ("Illinois EPA") submits amendments to 35 Ill. Adm. Code 243.108 and 243.125 for approval as revisions to the Illinois State Implementation Plan. The amendments update the ambient air quality standards in the Illinois Pollution Control Board's ("Board") air pollution control regulations to conform to the National Ambient Air Quality Standards adopted by the United States Environmental Protection Agency ("USEPA") pursuant to Section 109 of the CAA (42 U.S.C. § 7409).

The rulemaking was docketed by the Board as R24-15. The Notice of Proposed Amendments was published in the *Illinois Register* on March 22, 2024. In accordance with the requirements set forth in 40 CFR § 51.102, public notice was provided, and a public hearing was held April 18, 2024, in Chicago, Illinois, with video monitoring by the Illinois EPA from Springfield, Illinois. No public comments were made during the hearing and no comments were received by the Board. The Notice of Adopted Amendments was published in the *Illinois Register* on May 31, 2024, with an effective date of May 16, 2024.

The Illinois EPA is making this submission via USEPA's State Planning Electronic Collaboration System (SPeCS). A list of submitted documents is attached.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING AND COMMENT PERIOD PURSUANT TO 415 ILCS 5/10(H) and 1 ILCS 100/5-70(b)

Notice of Public Comment Period and Public Hearing for State Implementation Plan (SIP) Submittals for National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS)

The Pollution Control Board (Board) is accepting public comments and will conduct a public hearing on a prospective NAAQS SIP submittal to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA). The Board will accept written comments on the proposed rule that will form the basis for the SIP proposal until 45 days after the Notice of Proposed Amendments appears in the *Illinois Register*. A public hearing will be held on April 18, 2024. The Board presently anticipates adoption of amendments to the Illinois ambient air quality standards no later than October 12, 2024.

Section 10(H) of the Environmental Protection Act (Act) [415 ILCS 5/10(H)] requires the Board to do as follows:

[T]he Board shall adopt ambient air quality standards specifying the maximum permissible short-term and long-term concentrations of various contaminants in the atmosphere, those standards shall be identical in substance to the national ambient air quality standards promulgated by the Administrator of the United States Environmental Protection Agency in accordance with Section 109 of the Clean Air Act [(42 U.S.C. §7409 (2018))].

The USEPA NAAQS are codified at 40 C.F.R. §50. The Board is required to adopt those exemptions using the "identical in substance" rulemaking procedure of Section 7.2 of the Act [415 ILCS 5/7.2]. The Illinois listing of these compounds is codified at 35 Ill. Adm. Code 243. On March 7, 2024, the Board adopted a proposal for public comment in docket R24-15 to initiate adoption of the latest USEPA amendments to and actions affecting the federal NAAQS during the second half of 2023.

October 12, 2023 (88 Fed. Reg. 70595)

USEPA updated the current ozone absorption cross-section to the recommended consensus based cross-section value. The new value is 1.2% lower than the current value and reduces the uncertainty in the value. The adoption of this updated ozone absorption cross-section could result in increases in measured ozone concentrations. However, given the existing sources of

potential variability in monitoring data, it is unlikely that there will be any consistent measurable and predictable effect on reported data.

November 6, 2023 (88 Fed. Reg. 76212)

USEPA updated its *List of Designated Reference and Equivalent Methods* (List) on November 6, 2023. USEPA's update modified existing method designations and designated a new Federal Equivalent Method (FEM) for measuring concentrations of Particulate Matter (PM10) in ambient air. USEPA updated its *List of Designated Reference and Equivalent Methods* on November 6, 2023. The Board's rules incorporate the December 15, 2022 version of the List by reference. Updating the incorporation by reference to the December 15, 2023 version will incorporate the November 6, 2023 amendment noticed in the Federal Register. The Board proposes that update for public comment.

The Board submitted this Notice of Public Hearing and Public Comment together with a Notice of Proposed Amendments to appear in the *Illinois Register* relative to the docket R24-15 proposal.

The Board expects that the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Agency) will submit the present amendments to USEPA to be included in or to revise the Illinois SIP pertaining to one or more ambient air quality priority pollutants (carbon monoxide, lead nitrogen oxides, ozone, particulate matter, and sulfur dioxide) pursuant to section 110 of the federal Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. §7410(a) (2018)) and the implementing USEPA regulations. *See* 40 C.F.R. §51.102 and appendix V (2019).

As USEPA will require the State to have conducted a hearing on the amendments to the Illinois NAAQS rules involved in this proceeding pursuant to 42 U.S.C. §4210(a) and 40 C.F.R. §51.102 the Board scheduled a public hearing to allow the public to comment on the proposed amendments and the anticipated SIP revision. The Board will conduct that hearing by videoconference between the Board's offices in Chicago and Springfield, as follows:

OPINION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD (by B.F. Currie):

The Board today proposes amendments to the Illinois ambient air quality standards, responding to United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) actions during the second half of 2023.

This is an identical-in-substance (IIS) rulemaking under Sections 7.2 and 10(H) of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (Act) (415 ILCS 5/7.2 and 10(H) (2022)). Section 10(H) requires the Board to adopt standards that are identical in substance to the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) adopted by USEPA under section 109 of the Clean Air Act (CAA) (42 U.S.C. § 7409 (2023)).

Section 10(H) of the Act and Section 1-5(c)(1) of the Administrative Procedure Act (APA) (5 ILCS 100/5-1-5(c)(1) (2022)) further provide that Title VII of the Act (415 ILCS 5/Tit. VII (2022)) and Section 5-35 of the APA (5 ILCS 100/5-35 (2022)) do not apply to IIS rulemaking. Accordingly, the Board does not adopt a "First Notice" proposal and then a "Second Notice" proposal for review by JCAR. However, Section 7.2 of the Act requires the Board to consider comments from USEPA, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Agency), the Attorney General, and the public before adopting IIS rules.

The Board today revises the Illinois ambient air quality standards based on USEPA actions during the second half of 2023. The Board updates incorporations by reference to the Code of Federal Regulations in the Illinois rules. The Board also included a correction to the language of the rule as well as limited non-substantive corrections and revisions that the Board finds are needed.

The Board will submit the proposed amendments for publication in the *Illinois Register* and will receive public comments for at least 45 days after publication. The Board will also hold a public hearing on April 18, 2024. The Board expects to adopt final rules no later than October 12, 2024.

SUMMARY OF PROPOSED AMENDMENTS

Federal Actions Implemented

October 12, 2023 (88 Fed. Reg. 70595)

USEPA updated the current ozone absorption cross-section to the recommended consensus based cross-section value. The new value is 1.2% lower than the current value and reduces the uncertainty in the value. The adoption of this updated ozone absorption cross-section could result in increases in measured ozone concentrations. However, given the existing sources of potential variability in monitoring data, it is unlikely that there will be any consistent measurable and predictable effect on reported data.

November 6, 2023 (88 Fed. Reg. 76212)

USEPA updated its *List of Designated Reference and Equivalent Methods* (List) on November 6, 2023. USEPA's update modified existing method designations and designated a new Federal Equivalent Method (FEM) for measuring concentrations of Particulate Matter (PM10) in ambient air. The Board's rules incorporate the December 15, 2022 version of the List by reference. Updating the incorporation by reference to the December 15, 2022 version will incorporate the November 6, 2023 amendment noticed in the Federal Register. The Board proposes that update for public comment.

Board Corrections

In addition to nonsubstantive changes necessary to reflect current style, the Board also corrects Section 243.125(b)(3). In updating the reference to 40 CFR 50, Appendix D, the Board found that Section 243.125(b)(3) contained an error. When the Board adopted the underlying language in National Ambient Air Quality Standards, USEPA Amendments, R 16-2 (Mar. 3, 2016), the language was incorrectly included in the adopted language. The Board described the error as follows:

changed [the federal language] "designated in accordance with part 53 of this chapter or an equivalent method designated in accordance with part 53 of this chapter" to "designated by USEPA and listed in the List of Designated Methods or a Federal Register notice incorporated by reference in Section 243.108." R 16-2 slip op. at 15.

The Board makes that correction in this proceeding.

Persons wishing to testify on the record must be physically present at either of the two hearing locations given above. This does not limit the right of any person to submit public comments on the proposed amendments.

The Board invites public comment on the proposed amendments. The Board will receive public comments until at least 45 days after a notice of these proposed amendments appears in the *Illinois Register*. Anyone may file a public comment with the Board through the Clerk's Office On-Line (COOL) through the Board's website (pcb.illinois.gov). Public comments may also be addressed to the Clerk's office at the mailing address listed above.

After the hearing and public comment period, the Board will promptly issue an order adopting final rule amendments. The Board will then file the amendments with the Office of the Secretary of State, and a Notice of Adopted Amendments will appear in the *Illinois Register*. Any IEPA submission of the associated SIP revision to USEPA would follow that Notice.

The Board finds that these measures will satisfy the federal requirements for SIP revision, in 33 U.S.C. § 7410(a) (2023) and 40 C.F.R. § 51.102, as to subjects included in this proceeding.

ORDER

The Board directs the Clerk to provide notice in the *Illinois Register* of the appended proposed amendments to the Illinois ambient air quality regulations at 35 Ill. Adm. Code 243.

 - The 2008 primary and secondary eight-hour NAAQS for ozone is 0.075 ppm, daily maximum eight-hour average, measured by an FRM based on appendix D to 40 CFR 50, incorporated by reference in Section 243.108, and designated by USEPA and listed in the List of Designated Methods, incorporated by reference in Section 243.108, or an FEM designated by

- USEPA and listed in the List of Designated Methods, incorporated by reference in Section 243.108.
- The 2008 primary and secondary eight-hour NAAQS for ozone ambient air quality standards are met at an ambient air quality monitoring site when the three-year average of the annual fourth-highest daily maximum eight-hour average ozone concentration is less than or equal to 0.075 ppm, as determined in <u>compliance accordance</u> with appendix P to 40 CFR 50, incorporated by reference in Section 243.108.

A comprehensive description is contained in the Board's opinion and order of March 7, 2024, proposing amendments in docket R24-15 for public comment, which opinion and order is available from the address below. As is explained in that opinion, the Board will receive public comment on the proposed amendment for 45 days from the date it appears in the Illinois Register before proceeding to adopt amendment based on this proposal.

The docket in the R24-15 proceeding relates to the Illinois ambient air quality requirements in 35 Ill. Adm. Code 243 of the Illinois air pollution control rules. This amendment would update the Illinois ambient air quality requirements to correspond with amendments to the federal National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQSs) that the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) adopted during the second half of 2023. The Federal NAAQS are codified at 40 C.F.R. 50. During this period, USEPA amended implementation of its NAAQSs as follows:

October 12, 2023 (88 Fed. Reg. 70595)

USEPA updated the current ozone absorption cross-section to the recommended consensus based cross-section value. The new value is 1.2% lower than the current value and reduces the uncertainty in the value. The adoption of this updated ozone absorption cross-section could result in increases in measured ozone concentrations. However, given the existing sources of potential variability in monitoring data, it is unlikely that there will be any consistent measurable and predictable effect on reported data.



Happiness comes from success

John Stuart Mill said, "I have learned to seek my happiness by limiting my desires, rather than in attempting to satisfy them." That is a rather depressing, defeatist attitude, don't you think? Why not fight to achieve ambitions, however extravagant?

Today's deal doesn't require anything quite so extreme. It just needs declarer to remember what didn't happen in the bidding, what did happen in the play and where his dummy

Against four hearts, West leads the diamond ace. East signals encouragement with the eight, so West continues with the diamond king and his third diamond.

Now it could easily be right for East to lead the 13th diamond. If West has, say, queen-doubleton in hearts, this defense results in a trump promotion to defeat the contract. Here, though, the play is fatal. South discards his spade

loser and has an easy ride home. So let's suppose East switches to the spade 10. Not instantly fatal, but sufficiently revealing to a thoughtful South. As this switch marks West with the spade queen and jack, declared has "seen" 10 points in West's hand. Therefore, as West passed as dealer East surely has the club queen.

Displaying excellent technique, South wins the spade switch with his ace and draws three rounds of hearts ending in the dummy. He calls for the club jack and finesses when East plays low. Now comes a club to the ace, a spade to dummy's king and the club king, on which South discards his



OPINION AND ORDER OF THE BOARD (by B.F. Currie):

The Board today adopts amendments to the Illinois ambient air quality standards, responding to United States Environmental Agency (USEPA) actions during the second half of 2023.

This is an identical-in-substance (IIS) rulemaking under Sections 7.2 and 10(H) of the Illinois Environmental Protection Act (Act) (415 ILCS 5/7.2 and 10(H) (2022)). Section 10(H) requires the Board to adopt standards that are identical in substance to the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS) adopted by USEPA under section 109 of the Clean Air Act (CAA) (42 U.S.C. § 7409 (2024)).

Section 10(H) of the Act and Section 1-5(c)(1) of the Administrative Procedure Act (APA) (5 ILCS 100/5-1-5(c)(1) (2022)) further provide that Title VII of the Act (415 ILCS 5/Tit. VII (2022)) and Section 5-35 of the APA (5 ILCS 100/5-35 (2022)) do not apply to IIS rulemaking. Accordingly, the Board does not adopt a "First Notice" proposal and then a "Second Notice" proposal for review by the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR). However, Section 7.2 of the Act requires the Board to consider comments from USEPA, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Agency), the Attorney General, and the public before adopting IIS rules.

The Board today revises the Illinois ambient air quality standards based on USEPA actions during the second half of 2023. USEPA took two actions during this period. The first action reduces the current ozone cross-section value. The second action updates one incorporation by reference to incorporate one new federal reference method (FRM) into the Illinois rules. The Board also includes limited non-substantive corrections and revisions that the Board finds are needed.

The Board adopted a proposal for public comment on March 7, 2024. A Notice of Proposed Amendments appeared in the *Illinois Register* on March 22, 2024 at 48 Ill. Reg. 4283. The 45-day public comment period ended May 6, 2024.

Notice of the public hearing was published in the following publications: the *Chicago Sun-Times* on March 9, 2024; the *Belleville News-Democrat* on March 10, 2024; the *Rockford*

Register Star on March 10, 2024; the State Journal Register on March 11, 2024; the Centralia & Mt. Vernon Morning Sentinels on March 12, 2024; the Metropolis Planet on March 12, 2024; the Peoria Journal Star on March 10, 2024; the Moline Dispatch-Argus on March 13, 2024; the News-Gazette on March 11, 2024; and the Galena Gazette on March 13, 2024. The Board held a public hearing on the proposed amendments on April 18, 2024. No public comments were made during the hearing.

SUMMARY OF PROPOSED AMENDMENTS

October 12,2023 (88 Fed. Reg. 70595)

USEPA updated the current ozone cross-section to the recommended consensus based cross-section value. The new value is 1.2% lower than the current value and reduces the uncertainty in the value. The adoption of this updated ozone absorption cross-section could result in increases in measured ozone concentrations. However, given the existing sources of potential variability in monitoring data, it is unlikely that there will be any consistent measurable and predictable effect on reported data.

November 6, 2023 (88 Fed. Reg. 76212)

USEPA updated its *List of Designated Reference and Equivalent Methods* (List) on November 6, 2023. USEPA's update modified existing method designations and designated a new Federal Equivalent Method for measuring concentrations of Particulate Matter (PM10) in ambient air. This update also includes a new equivalent method for measuring concentrations of Lead(pb). Currently, the Board's rules incorporate the December 15, 2022 version of the List by reference. To include the amendments noticed in the November 6, 2023 Federal Register, the Board incorporates by reference the December 15, 2023 version of the List, which includes the new methods for PM₁₀ and lead.

Requests for Comments

The Board requested that interested persons review this opinion and order and submit comments on the proposed amendments. The Board did not receive any comments on this proposal.

ORDER

The Board directs the Clerk to file the adopted amendments with the Office of the Secretary of State and provide notice in the *Illinois Register* of the appended adopted amendments to the Illinois ambient air quality regulations at 35 Ill. Adm. Code 243.

- Summary and Purpose of Rulemaking: The following briefly describes the subjects and issues involved in this rulemaking. A comprehensive description is contained in the Board's opinion and order of March 7, 2024, proposing amendments in docket R24-15 for public comment, which opinion and order is available from the address below. As is explained in that opinion, the Board will receive public comment on the proposed amendment for 45 days from the date it appears in the *Illinois Register* before proceeding to adopt amendment based on this proposal.

The docket in the R24-15 proceeding relates to the Illinois ambient air quality requirements in 35 Ill. Adm. Code 243 of the Illinois air pollution control rules. This amendment would update the Illinois ambient air quality requirements to correspond with amendments to the federal National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQSs) that the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) adopted during the second half of 2023. The Federal NAAQS are codified at 40 C.F.R. 50. During this period, USEPA amended implementation of its NAAQSs as follows:

October 12, 2023 (88 Fed. Reg. 70595)

USEPA updated the current ozone absorption cross-section to the recommended consensus based cross-section value. The new value is 1.2% lower than the current value and reduces the uncertainty in the value. The adoption of this updated ozone absorption cross-section could result in increases in measured ozone concentrations. However, given the existing sources of potential variability in monitoring data, it is unlikely that there will be any consistent measurable and predictable effect on reported data.

November 6, 2023 (88 Fed. Reg. 76212)

USEPA updated its List of Designated Reference and Equivalent Methods (List) on November 6, 2023. USEPA's update modified existing method designations and designated a new Federal Equivalent Method (FEM) for measuring concentrations of Particulate Matter (PM10) in ambient air. USEPA updated its List of Designated Reference and Equivalent Methods on November 6, 2023. The Board's rules incorporate

the December 15, 2022 version of the List by reference. Updating the incorporation by reference to the December 15, 2023 version will incorporate the November 6, 2023 amendment noticed in the Federal Register. The Board proposes that update for public comment.

 - The 2008 primary and secondary eight-hour NAAQS for ozone ambient air quality standards are met at an ambient air quality monitoring site when the three-year average of the annual fourth-highest daily maximum eight-hour average ozone concentration is less than or equal to 0.075 ppm, as determined in complianceaecordance with appendix P to 40 CFR 50, incorporated by reference in Section 243.108.

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- b) 2015 Primary and Secondary Eight-Hour NAAQS for Ozone
 - The level of the eight-hour primary NAAQS for ozone is 0.070 ppm, daily maximum eight-hour average, measured by a reference method based on appendix D to 40 CFR 50, incorporated by reference in Section 243.108, or an equivalent method designated by USEPA and listed in the List of Designated Methods or a Federal Register notice incorporated by reference in Section 243.108.
 - The eight-hour primary NAAQS for ozone is met at an ambient air quality monitoring site when the three-year average of the annual fourth-highest daily maximum eight-hour average ozone concentration is less than or equal to 0.070 ppm, as determined in <u>complianceaecordance</u> with appendix U to 40 CFR 50, incorporated by reference in Section 243.108.
 - The level of the secondary NAAQS for ozone is 0.070 ppm, daily maximum eight-hour average ozone concentration, measured by a reference method based on appendix D to 40 CFR 50, incorporated by reference in Section 243.108, and designated in accordance with part 53 of this chapter or an equivalent method designated by USEPA and listed in the List of Designated Methods or a Federal Register notice incorporated by reference in Section 243.108.
 - 4) The eight-hour secondary NAAQS for ozone is met at an ambient air quality monitoring site when the three-year average of the annual fourth-highest daily maximum eight-hour average ozone concentration is less than or equal to 0.070 ppm, as determined in <u>complianceaecordance</u> with appendix U to 40 CFR 50, incorporated by reference in Section 243.108.
