Subject: Label Changes in Support of Propargite Early Mitigation Plan – Ornamental Uses,

Deletion and Prohibition of the Use of Propargite Products

#### Dear Marcia Trostle:

You are receiving this letter because your company holds active registrations for propargite products. Prior to the publication of the Proposed Registration Review Interim Decision (PID) for propargite, EPA met with the technical registrants for propargite products (i.e., companies holding registrations of propargite products for manufacturing use). During the meeting on November 3, 2020, EPA and the technical registrants discussed what uses with low or no usage can be removed to refine the drinking water assessment, which in turn would help address the cancer dietary risks of concern. The technical registrants offered to remove the ornamental uses from the product registrations and the labels.

In April 2021, EPA published the PID for propargite (available in <a href="www.regulations.gov">www.regulations.gov</a> under Document ID EPA-HQ-OPP-2014-0131-0061) which included the proposed cancellation of ornamental uses. The Agency did not receive any comments about the proposed cancellation of ornamental uses.

To make sure that ornamental uses are not accounted for in the revised drinking water assessment and consequently in the human health risk assessment, we ask registrants to submit the following: (1) voluntary cancelation/use deletion request as stated in FIFRA Section 6(f) of the Federal Insecticide and Rodenticide Act (FIFRA); and (2) revised label(s) showing the deletion of the ornamental uses and prohibition of the use of propargite on ornamental uses, as applicable to your label.

The uses that will be cancelled are the following:

Ornamental carnations and chrysanthemums;

- Ornamental evergreens;
- Ornamental herbaceous plants;
- Ornamental conifers;
- Ornamental and/or shade; and
- Other ornamental field and nursery uses.

- The use of propargite on Christmas trees and conifers grown in containers.
- The use of propargite on non-bearing crops grown in containers.

To submit the voluntary cancelation/use deletion request, address the letter to the Chemical Review Manager, Concepción (Conchi) Rodríguez. Send it via EPA's Central Data Exchange (CDX; https://cdx.epa.gov) using the Pesticide Submission Portal (PSP). In the PSP, please use the following sequence of steps: "Registration and Exemptions > General Registration > Product Registration – Section 3 > Amendment > (Document Type = Other)."

EPA requests the amendments to the propargite product label be submitted to the Agency for review on or before August 22, 2024, which is 45 days from the date of this letter. Within the required timeframe, submit a cover letter, a completed Application for Registration (EPA form 8570-1) and copies of your amended product label. For each label, submit two copies, a clean copy, and an annotated copy with changes. Include the following statement on the Application for Registration (EPA form 8570-1):

"I certify that this amendment satisfies the requirements of EPA's early mitigation measures and no other changes have been made to the labeling of this product I understand that it is a violation of 18 U.S.C. Section 1001 to willfully make any false statement to EPA.
