GLASSPORT WOMAN CHARGED WITH HINDERING APPREHENSION OF MAN WANTED ON BENCH WARRANT

Pittsburgh PA ---- Sheriff Kevin M. Kraus announced today that a Pittsburgh man with a firearms related bench warrant has been taken into custody and his girlfriend has been charged with hindering his apprehension.

20-year-old Rayshawn Poindexter has been a fugitive since May of this year after a bench warrant was issued for a violation of probation connected to a guilty plea earlier this year involving a firearms charge. Over the past two weeks, detectives from our office developed information that Poindexter was staying at his girlfriend's house along Vermont Avenue in Glassport.

On Thursday, October 10, 2024, detectives approached the residence and subsequently spoke with 20-year-old Dominae Solomon, Poindexter's girlfriend. Solomon told detectives that Poindexter was not present and that she hadn't seen him for two weeks, and that they were free to check the residence. Detectives eventually found Poindexter in an upstairs bedroom at the residence and during the search noticed bags of suspected drugs on a table and a large amount of cash on a shelf.

Both Solomon and Poindexter denied any knowledge of the suspected drugs at which point detectives were granted a search warrant for the residence. The search produced a black and silver Jimenez Arms handgun, several bags of suspected drugs, including suspected fentanyl, and more than \$16,000 in cash.

Poindexter and Solomon were transported to the Allegheny County Jail with Solomon facing several drug charges as well as one count of hinder apprehension and one count of receiving stolen property connected to the handgun. In addition to the bench warrant, Poindexter was arraigned on several drug counts filed in March by City of Pittsburgh Police.
