## **DECLARATION OF DISASTER**

WHEREAS, the National Drought Mitigation Center, the United States Department of Agriculture, and the National Oceanic Atmosphere Association have formed the United States Drought Monitor ('USDM'); and

**WHEREAS**, the USDM monitors drought conditions across the United States and as of October 17, 2024 has classified 100% of Brazos County being in moderate drought conditions; and

**WHEREAS**, the Keetch-Byram Drought Index ('KBDI'), maintained by Texas A&M Agrilife Research and Texas A&M Forest Service, is an index that is used to determine fire potential and the current KBDI indicates an estimated KBDI overall average value of 737 for Brazos County on a scale of 0-800 as of October 17, 2024; and

**WHEREAS**, Brazos County is now within the highest range KBDI and is at risk of increased wildfire occurrence; and

**WHEREAS**, Brazos County has, and is continuing, to experience wildfires across the County; and

**WHEREAS**, the above conditions pose a substantial, significant, and imminent threat to persons and property in Brazos County; and

**WHEREAS**, Brazos County is currently under a burn ban order for the entire County; and

**WHEREAS**, On October 14, 2024 Texas Governor, Greg Abbot, issued a Disaster Declaration for 143 counties in Texas due to elevated fire weather conditions, which included Brazos County; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with provisions of the Texas Disaster Act of 1975 (Section 418.108 Texas Government Code); a state of disaster is being declared due to drought conditions and fire danger that exist in Brazos County and present an imminent and substantial danger to the residents of Brazos County; and

WHEREAS, said state of disaster requires that certain emergency protective measures to be taken pursuant to Texas Disaster Act of 1975 relating to emergency

management and public protection, pursuant to Chapter 418 of the Texas Government Code; and

**WHEREAS**, a declaration of local disaster includes the ability to reduce potential for damage to property, and request assistance from the governor of state resources; and

**WHEREAS**, by this declaration, I declare all rules and regulations that may inhibit or prevent prompt response to this threat be suspended for the duration of the incident; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the authority granted to the County Judge under the Texas Disaster Act of 1975, I authorize the use of all available resources of state government and political subdivisions to assist in the County's response to this situation.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, by the authority granted to me by the Texas Disaster Act (Government Code Chapter 418, paragraph 418.108) and the Interjurisdictional Emergency Management Plan for Brazos County, Texas A&M University, and the cities of Bryan, College Station, Kurten, and Wixon Valley and as Presiding Officer for Brazos County, I do hereby declare a local state of disaster due to drought conditions and fire danger. This Declaration shall continue for a period of not more than seven days of the date hereof, unless the same is continued by consent of the Commissioners Court of the County of Brazos, Texas. Additionally, this Declaration shall take effect immediately from and after its issuance.
