Celebrations of the 78th Independence Day of India in Bhutan

- 1. The 78th Independence Day of India was celebrated with patriotic fervour at a ceremony held at India House on 15 August 2024. Ambassador of India to Bhutan Shri Sudhakar Dalela led the Indian community to unfurl the tricolour at the India House followed by singing of the National Anthem.
