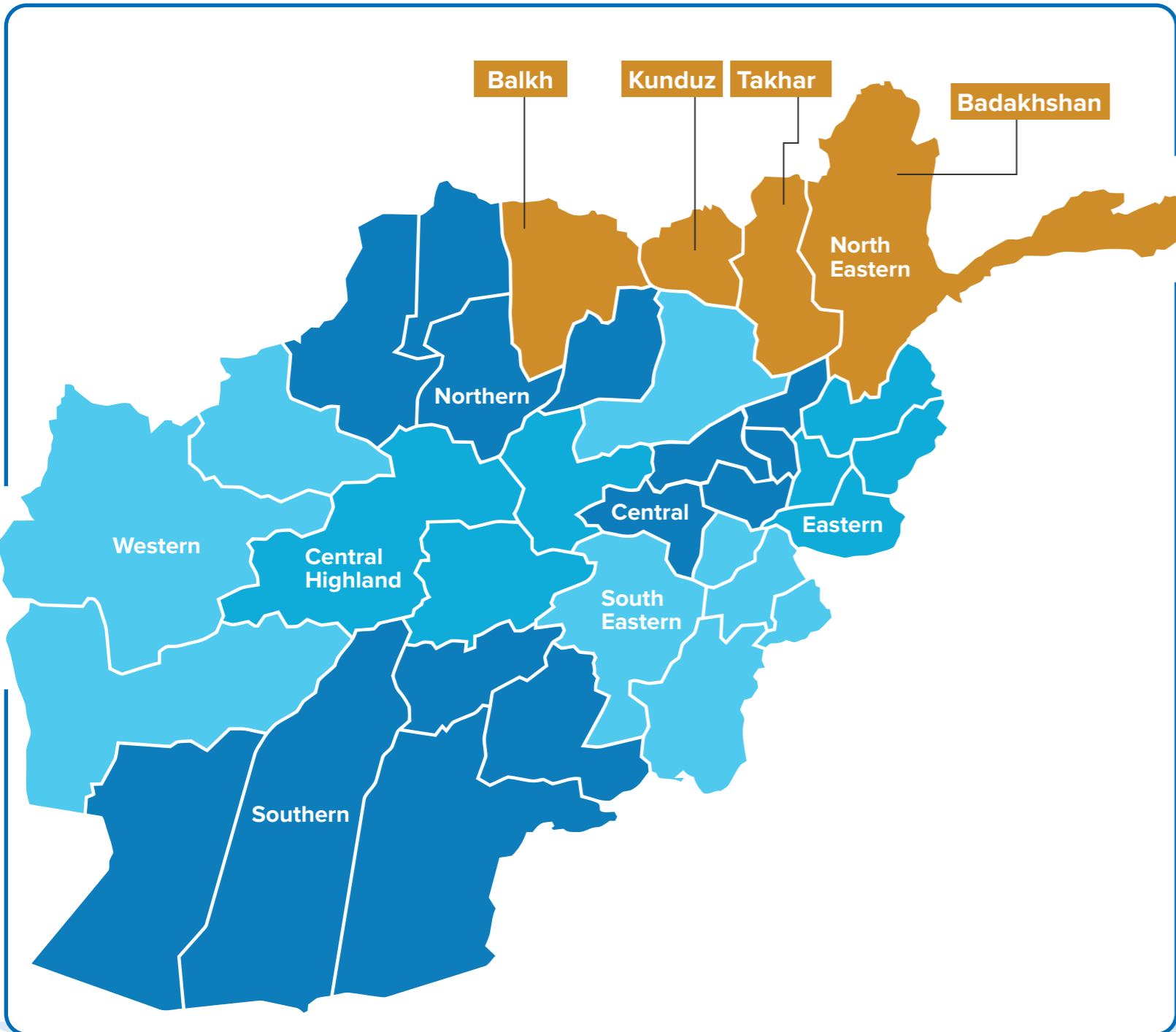

Supporting Women

1,400 women in total entrepreneurs as well as 140 women-led small and micro businesses will directly benefit from project

140 women-led small and micro businesses will directly benefit from project interventions

7 provinces were selected based on the rate of women's labour participation while taking into account the security situation and prevailing restrictions.

100 facilities will be constructed to support capacity building and women's economic empowerment activities.



Jobs Creation

2,800 jobs will be created or recovered.



Increasing Income

25% income of supported women entrepreneurs will improve.
