



## Our members<sup>1</sup> operate a well-connected, highly flexible critical energy infrastructure.

We provide consumers and companies with access to affordable energy and our assets can advance Europe's energy transition in an integrated energy system and ensure industrial competitiveness.

EU storages can hold 4 months of EU gas demand, 29 LNG terminals imported a third of EU gas demand in 2023 and 260,000 km of large underground pipelines enable gas supply to 100 million households and thousands of companies

On a cold winter day, our **pipelines** transport and deliver 29,000 GWh of energy throughout Europe.

Putting these valuable assets to use during the energy crisis enabled Europe to rapidly diversify gas imports via LNG terminals, secure sufficient energy by filling underground storages and adapt gas flows from West to East. All of this brought energy costs down and ensured industrial competitiveness.

Gas infrastructure will continue to facilitate security of supply of both molecules and electrons. Today, we are mostly handling natural gas, and we also import, store and transport growing volumes of biomethane and hydrogen, while gearing up to bring CO2 from industrial sites to underground storages.
