Though water related accidents can occur suddenly, taking proper precautions can help to prevent them. Remember to closely supervise children, have flotation devices readily available, and familiarize yourself with CPR techniques. By following these water safety reminders, we significantly reduce the likelihood of any unfortunate incidents.

Next, I'd like to bring attention to a few reminders as we prepare for 4th of July celebrations. Please remember that all fireworks are illegal in the City of Laguna Niguel. If you come across illegal firework activity, I ask that you please call the Orange County Sheriff's Department's Non-Emergency Dispatch at 949-770-6011. I must emphasize that it's crucial to keep 9-1-1 lines open for emergencies, such as medical emergencies, crimes in progress, and fires. However, if you or someone else's safety is potentially at risk, please dial 911 right away. As a safe celebration alternative, I encourage you to participate in the full day of patriotic festivities planned at Crown Valley Park this 4th of July.

To close, I want to assure you that my team and I remain committed to working closely with our community to ensure the safety and security of all residents.
