Scheduled daytime and nighttime work on Pacific Coast Highway in Seal Beach Sept.4-6

ORANGE COUNTY –The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will have scheduled work in the City of Seal Beach at various locations on State Route 1 (SR-1), also known as Pacific Coast Highway (PCH). Barring any emergencies (which may include weather), daytime closures are scheduled to begin Wednesday, September 4 until Friday, September 6, 2024, from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. The work will include concrete barrier removal, replacement and removal of curb ramps, and underground electrical work. There will be night work to install k-rail from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Updates will be provided as the work progresses.

Daytime closures Wednesday, September 4 - Friday, September 6

- Northbound SR-1 #2 (right lane) from Seal Beach Boulevard to Orange/Los Angeles County Line
- Southbound SR-1 #2 (right lane) from Orange/Los Angeles County Line to Seal Beach Boulevard

Nighttime closures Wednesday, September 4- Friday, September 6:

- Northbound SR-1 #2 (right lane) from Warner Avenue/Phillips Street to Seal Beach Boulevard
- Southbound SR-1 #2 (right lane) from Seal Beach Boulevard to Warner Avenue/Phillips Street

Please obey all posted signs and traffic instructions for the safety of Caltrans crews and travelers.

Caltrans appreciates the public's patience while we perform this work. Electronic changeable message signs will notify drivers of the closure. The work schedule is subject to change due to traffic incidents, weather, availability of equipment and/or materials, and/or construction-related issues.
