SUNNYVALE NAMED A HOST CITY FOR NLC CENTENNIAL 'ROADSHOW'

SUNNYVALE, Calif. – The National League of Cities (NLC) selected the City of Sunnyvale as an official stop for their <u>Centennial Roadshow: 100 Years, 100 Cities</u>. The roadshow is part of NLC's year-long celebration, marking a century of commitment to advancing local government and advocating for the interests of cities, towns and villages nationwide.

As one of only 100 cities selected, Sunnyvale hosted the NLC on Saturday, Aug. 3. During their visit, City officials provided a tour of the downtown and new City Hall. They also focused on the City's sustainability and housing priorities. "We were delighted to highlight Sunnyvale's many exciting initiatives and accomplishments as part of this special event," stated Mayor Larry Klein. "Sunnyvale has been a long-standing member of the NLC and we look forward to another 100 years of partnership."

The roadshow includes stops in every region of the country, aimed at spotlighting the diversity, resilience, and transformation of America's local communities. It kicked off in February at the University of Kansas in Lawrence, Kansas, where NLC was founded. Since then, the roadshow has been stopping in cities of all sizes to showcase their unique stories.

"It is truly an honor for NLC to visit remarkable municipalities like Sunnyvale that have made significant contributions to the advancement of local government over the past 100 years," said Clarence Anthony, CEO and Executive Director of the National League of Cities. "Each of these cities has played a pivotal role in moving our local communities forward and has a unique story that showcases transformative change. As we celebrate and chart a course for the next 100 years, I am more excited than ever for the future of cities, towns, and villages and look forward to continuing important work together."

As the journey progresses, the roadshow will continue making stops in cities across the country, including Tampa, Florida, where NLC will host its annual City Summit conference and culminating event this November.
