Chair Werner will guide the Delta ISB for the next two years as the Board continues providing independent oversight of scientific programs that support Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta decision-making.

"As we look ahead, I am excited about the work we will undertake together, including completing the three thematic reviews on food webs, subsidence, and decision-making under deep uncertainty, and embarking on new reviews, including one on contaminant monitoring in the Delta," said Chair Werner.

Chair Werner succeeds Dr. Lisa Wainger, who completed her two-year term as chair of the Board on August 31, 2024, and now serves as past chair. "Together, we have laid a strong foundation for continued success of the Delta ISB, said Past Chair Dr. Lisa Wainger. "I am excited to see what the future holds for this incredible board."

Prior to joining the Delta ISB in November 2022, Dr. Werner was director of the Swiss Centre for Applied Ecotoxicology for nine years. In Switzerland, she worked closely with federal and local environmental agencies to improve monitoring programs and cooperated in research projects with academic institutions throughout Europe and the United States. Projects included assessments of advanced wastewater treatment technologies and environmental risks due to pesticides.

Throughout her career, Dr. Werner has served on numerous panels and working groups. Most recently, this has included the Scientific Advisory Council of the German Federal Institute of Hydrology, which is the primary German institution advising the federal ministries in matters of utilization and management of waterways, and the Guidance Committee for the Assessment of Surface Water

Resources in Switzerland, which advises decision-makers in all aspects of surface water stewardship.
