LEGAL SERVICES OF NEW JERSEY NEWSLETTER FOCUSES ON DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND PROTECTIONS FOR VICTIMS

EDISON — The latest newsletter of Legal Services of New Jersey (LSNJ) centers on

important laws and rights involving various forms of domestic violence, and how fearful victims

can seek protection from abusers.

October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month and the newsletter lists and explains the

19 crimes under state law that can be linked to situations of alleged abuse and other acts of

domestic violence.

"If you think you have been a victim of any of these crimes, you should contact any attorney

or your local domestic violence agency," the article stresses, noting the New Jersey Domestic

The newsletter deals with obtaining temporary restraining orders against abusers, whose

alleged violations are tied to any of the 19 specified criminal laws, including, among others,

harassment, assault, terroristic threats, restraint, coercion and cyber-harassment.

Depending upon the circumstances, victims can request restraining orders under the state's

Prevention of Domestic Violence Act, or protective orders under the Victim's Assistance and

Survivor Protection Act. The article explains the differences between the two.

Others articles in the newsletter deals with renters' rights, health care options for college students, and the availability of free at-home COVID-19 tests.

Legal Services of New Jersey (LSNJ), located in Edison, heads the state's Legal Services system, a network of six independent nonprofit corporations that provides free essential legal aid in civil matters to low-income people in all 21 counties.
