Absentee Voting Will Go On, Despite Nearby Bridge Project

The St. Charles County Election Authority says absentee voting will continue as scheduled through August 5 at election headquarters on Turner Boulevard, despite Reconstruction of the nearby Highway 79 bridge over Interstate 70.

"We will be open all day on August 5 for absentee voters, from 8:30 in the morning until 5 o'clock," says Election Authority Director Kurt Bahr.

Starting August 5th, the Missouri Department of Transportation is restricting Highway 79 bridge lanes at Interstate 70.

MoDOT says drivers can expect detours, shifted lanes and delays starting at 9 in the morning August 5.

Motorists looking to vote at the nearby Election Authority Headquarters at 397 Turner Blvd., St. Peters, will have to follow detour signs, but the polls will be open.

Absentee voters can also cast their ballots through Friday, August 2 at another location: the Element Church, 100 Mall Parkway #500, Wentzville.

Voter turnout for the August 6 primary in St. Charles County is projected to reach 30%. The County has 105 polling locations. Voters will need their photo ID to comply with state law.
