The Principal Real Estate Income Fund seeks to provide high current income, with capital appreciation as a secondary objective, by investing in higheryielding debt and equity commercial real estate-related investments.

- The Fund will rely on the Sub-advisor's experience in the U.S. Commercial Mortgage-Backed Securities (CMBS) and global real estate-related securities markets to invest in both asset classes
- Potential for attractive current income provided by allocation to debt securities while equity allocation offers income with potential capital appreciation
- Dynamic investment strategy provides flexibility to position the Fund for success based on the market outlook of the Fund's investment sub-adviser

Quarterly manager commentary

(as of 6/30/24)

Market volatility picked up in April on renewed fears that the Fed would not lower rates at all in 2024 after strong retail sales and CPI prints surprised the market. The market took a . 180-degree turn in May and June, however, as inflation moved lower, and job growth stayed in a range, indicating a soft landing may be achievable. Equity markets rallied with the S&P 500 up over 4.25% and corporate bond spreads tightened and after 10-year treasury rates sold off 50bps in April, rates rallied 30bps to end the quarter at 4.40%.

CMBS spreads ended the quarter mixed, and the credit curve flattened with 10yr AAA spreads 13bps wider and BBB spreads 122bps tighter. CMBS new issue activity increased during the second quarter driven by a material pick up in SASB issuance amidst strong investor demand which pressured spreads on higher rated credit. Private label issuance was up 48% from the first quarter of 2024 and over 2.5 times from the second quarter of 2023. Against this backdrop, the portfolio's holdings of Commercial Mortgage-Backed Securities posted a quarterly return of 3.54% while global real estate securities were up 0.11% (return figures reported on a gross, unlevered basis).

Office headline risk caught the market's attention as the SASB loan on 1740 Broadway in New York was liquidated with a 62% loss. The originally rated AAA bond took a 26% write-down, and the rest of the bonds were wiped out. There are more SASB losses expected with more AAA rated bonds taking losses which highlights the heightened idiosyncratic risk that is in the market.

Real estate risk premiums remain elevated compared to other asset classes, but excess risk premium associated with a recession in the U.S. have been taken out of the CMBS market. REITs tend to perform better against equities in the later stages of the rate hike cycle but the potential for the cycle to be prolonged given the outlook for rate cuts getting pushed back weighed on REIT performance. Volatility is likely to persist given elevated market uncertainty, but longer-term returns may benefit from currently wide risk premiums in REITS.

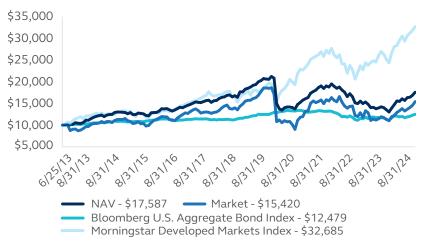
