NEW YORK, NY – In recognition of National Adoption Month, the New York City Administration for Children's Services (ACS) is thanking New Yorkers who have adopted children from foster care as well as the professionals who work to support the adoption process. ACS encourages other caring New Yorkers to learn about adoption and foster care.

National Adoption Month is celebrated every November across the country to recognize and thank those who have opened their hearts and homes to create forever families for children in foster care. While most children in foster care return home to their families, those who are unable to reunify safely can be adopted by a loving family.

Most children in foster care return home safely to their families, but there are times that is not possible.
