A BILL

To amend the Klamath Basin Water Supply Enhancement Act of 2000 to provide the Secretary of the Interior with certain authorities with respect to projects affecting the Klamath Basin watershed, and for other purposes. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Klamath Basin Water
5 Agreement Support Act of 2024".

6 SEC. 2. KLAMATH PROJECT WATER AND POWER.

7 (a) ADDRESSING WATER, POWER, AND FACILITIES
8 MANAGEMENT FOR IRRIGATION.—Section 4 of the Klamath
9 Basin Water Supply Enhancement Act of 2000 (Public
10 Law 106–498) is amended by adding at the end the fol11 lowing:

12 "(d) RESTORATION ACTIVITIES.—The Secretary 13 may—

14 "(1) plan, design, construct, operate, and main15 tain projects in the Klamath Basin watershed, includ16 ing—

17	"(A) facilities to reduce fish entrainment;
18	(B) projects that reduce or avoid impacts
19	on aquatic resources of facilities involved in the
20	storage or diversion of water for irrigation in the
21	Klamath Project service area; and
22	"(C) projects that restore habitats in the
23	Klamath Basin watershed, including Tribal fish-
24	ery resources held in trust;

1	"(2) undertake studies, including feasibility
2	studies, and improvements that the Secretary deter-
3	mines to be necessary to implement this subsection;
4	"(3) in implementing this subsection, enter into
5	contracts, memoranda of understanding, financial as-
6	sistance agreements, cost-sharing agreements, or other
7	appropriate agreements with—
8	"(A) State, Tribal, and local governmental
9	agencies; and
10	"(B) private parties; and
11	"(4) accept and expend non-Federal funds in
12	order to facilitate implementation of this subsection.
13	"(e) GOALS.—The goals of activities under subsections
14	(b) and (d) shall include, as applicable—
15	"(1) the short-term and long-term reduction and
16	resolution of conflicts relating to water in the Klam-
17	ath Basin watershed; and
18	"(2) compatibility and utility for protecting nat-
19	ural resources throughout the Klamath Basin water-
20	shed, including the protection, preservation, and res-
21	toration of Klamath River Tribal fishery resources,
22	particularly through collaboratively developed agree-
23	ments.
24	"(f) PUMPING PLANT D.—The Secretary may enter
25	into 1 or more agreements with the Tulelake Irrigation Dis-

1 trict to reimburse the Tulelake Irrigation District for not more than 69 percent of the cost incurred by the Tulelake 2 3 Irrigation District for the operation and maintenance of 4 Pumping Plant D, subject to the condition that the cost re-5 sults in benefits to the United States.

6 "(q) INFRASTRUCTURE.—

7 "(1) KENO AND LINK RIVER DAMS.—The Sec-8 retary of the Interior shall comply with the terms of 9 the agreement entitled '2016 Klamath Power and Fa-10 cilities Agreement'('Agreement'), including Attach-11 ment A to the Agreement.

12 "(2) Replacement of c canal flume.—

13 "(A) IN GENERAL.—The replacement of the 14 C Canal flume within the Klamath Project shall 15 be considered to be, and shall receive the treat-16 ment authorized for, qualified emergency ex-17 traordinary operation and maintenance work in 18 accordance with Federal reclamation law (the 19 Act of June 17, 1902 (32 Stat. 388, chapter 20 1093), and Acts supplemental to and amend-21 atory of that Act (43 U.S.C. 371 et seq.)). 22

"(B) CONTRACT.—

23 "(i) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 24 days after the date of receipt of a request 25 from the Klamath Irrigation District to

1	enter into a contract with that district to
2	amend the contract numbered 16-WC-20-
3	4838, the Secretary shall enter into a con-
4	tract with the Klamath Irrigation District
5	providing that under the contract entered
6	into under this subparagraph—
7	"(I) 35 percent of the total repay-
8	ment obligation is nonreimbursable to
9	the United States; and
10	"(II) 65 percent of the total re-
11	payment obligation shall be repaid to
12	the United States over a period of 50
13	years.
14	"(ii) Inclusion.—Although the Sec-
15	retary shall not condition the agreement to
16	the contract entered into under subpara-
17	graph (A) on any other term, the contract
18	may include other terms that are not less
19	favorable to the contractor than contract
20	numbered 16–WC–20–4838.".
21	(b) Administration; Effect.—
22	(1) COMPLIANCE.—In implementing the amend-
23	ments made by this section, the Secretary of the Inte-
24	rior shall comply with—

1	(A) the National Environmental Policy Act
2	of 1969 (42 U.S.C. 4321 et seq.);
3	(B) the Endangered Species Act of 1973 (16
4	U.S.C. 1531 et seq.); and
5	(C) all other applicable laws.
6	(2) EFFECT.—None of the amendments made by
7	this section—
8	(A) modify any authority or obligation of
9	the United States with respect to any Tribal
10	trust or treaty obligation of the United States;
11	(B) create or determine any water right; or
12	(C) affect any water right or water right
13	claim in existence on the date of the enactment
14	of this Act.
